

**COLLEGE COURSES FREQUENTLY TAKEN BY
HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS**

The following is a chart showing **some** of the university courses that students frequently take while they are still in high school (of course, they take many other transferable courses that are not shown on this list; these are just some of the ones we see most often). In addition to simply being called "college courses", these courses may also be referred to as "PSEO" or "CAPP" courses. To receive transfer credit for the courses, students need to have an **official transcript** sent to the UWSP Admissions Office from the university that offered the course. The students must have received a grade of "D" or higher to get credit for the course.
