- Think of different ways to gain experience not only in German but also in [communication and writing](#)

- Take a diverse curriculum to broaden perspectives
- Apply to relevant summer jobs [or volunteer opportunities](#) related to education/teaching

- Volunteer at World Languages Fair, the [Portage County Literacy Council](#) or any campus/local community events
- Create a profile on LinkedIn

- Apply for student teaching
- Create an account in WECAN to apply for teaching positions
- Research places and schools where you might want to teach in the future
- Network with [UWSP alumni](#) working in education, or across countries, languages, and cultures
- If interested in teaching at the college level or administration jobs in K-12, apply to graduate schools
