- Enroll in MLS 125: Intro to Medical **Laboratory Sciences**
- Enroll in HSW 100: Student Success in Health Sciences and Wellness
- Explore the foundation of MLS through the intro biology and chemistry courses
- Establish a 4-year plan with a SHSW adviser

- · Decide on an emphasis:

 - Histotechnology
 - Medical Technology
- · Consider a chemistry minor
- Apply and interview for acceptance into the MLS program during spring of second year
- · Register for core MLS courses

- Apply and interview for 6- or 9-month clinical practicum site at affiliated hospital
- Take MLS prep courses needed for Clinical Practicum the summer before senior year
- · Complete Practicum credits at partnering institution for final two semesters
- All Histotechnology students complete practicum at Marshfield Clinic in Marshfield, WI
- All Cytotechnology students complete practicum at UW-Madison in Madison, WI
- Apply for graduation
