SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

1. Associate degree graduates must have earned a minimum grade point average of 2.75. An ineligible candidate may appeal for consideration through the Head, School of Health Care Professions.
2. The UWSP required courses, Biology 160: Animal Biology (5 credits), CLS 105: Evolution of Health Care and Health Care Professions (3 credits), HS 105: Survey of Common Diseases, and CLS 295: Medical Terminology (2 credits) will be waived.
3. NTC courses 10-806-177 Anatomy and Physiology (4 credits) will be accepted in lieu of Biology 285: Human Physiology, 10-809-196 Intro to Sociology (3) will be accepted in lieu of Sociology 101, and 10-809-198 Intro to Psych (3) will be accepted in lieu of Psych 110, if a grade of C or better has been earned. An ineligible candidate may appeal for consideration through the Head, School of Health Care Professions.
4. The acceptance of credits applies only to students who have successfully complete the certification exam of the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.
5. The acceptance of credits applies only to this Program-to-Program Articulation.
6. For acceptance of equivalent courses, NTC courses must have been completed within the last 5 years. Beyond this period of time, course equivalents will be assessed on an individual basis.
7. This agreement is subject to review if either NTC or UWSP undergoes curriculum revision **OR** within five years of the origination date of this agreement, whichever occurs earlier.
