<mark>SIGN UP</mark> NOW FOR...

- to alter your child's schedule during the week of exams (Dec. 16th 20th). The sign-up sheet is posted on the wall to your immediate right upon entering the UCLCC from the elevator. Deadline is the end of the day **Friday**, **November 15**th otherwise your regular contracted fees will be charged. If a family does not sign-up for exam week by the set deadline, regular semester fees will be charged regardless of if a two-week notice is given of any schedule changes or notice of withdrawal during these weeks. The exception to the ability to alter your child's schedule is the starlight classroom; they remain full-time during exam weeks.
- Winterim Care (Jan. 6-17) Register by Friday, November 15^{th.} We will be closed for Martin Luther King Day, January 20, 2025.
- Semester II (Starts TUESDAY, January 21, 2025) All Families need to register for each individual session IF your schedule is changing from the fall semester.
- If your schedule is the same for the FULL academic year or calendar year from when you initially registered, no action is required.

Families Helpful Tips Corner

More on Conscious Discipline...

We here at the UCLCC continue with our professional development and implementation of Conscious Discipline (CD). I would encourage you to find out more on CD by visiting https://consciousdiscipline.com/. Last month's newsletter touched on helpful words. Here is a reminder of what was covered and hopefully some of you have begun implementing at home.

"Helpful Words"; things that are helpful to say to children. Here are a few examples of some of the language we try to use:

- 1. Teaching a child to be more assertive sounds like this: "Did you like that? Tell your friend, 'I don't like it when you (insert hurtful action), Please (insert new skill)."
- 2. Encouragement sounds like this "You (describe in detail without judgement) so (how the action impacted others). That was helpful! Example: "You picked up the toy so Jill wouldn't step on it. That was helpful."
- 3. A positive way to deal with unwanted behavior is to tell the child what you want. "You can...". We try to notice instead of judge. Example "You wanted to go down the slide, so you pushed Jill out of the way. When you want Jill to move, say "Move Jill". Try it with me. Say "Move Jill".

It is beneficial to practice the desired behavior with an adult. When children are whining or yelling, we say "match your voice to mine". Lets shift our focus from "getting children to do something" to noticing why they are doing what they are doing.

"Love Rituals"; this month's focus is on making a connection with a child. Love Rituals are a great way to connect with all children. I Love You Rituals create neural connections in the brain because our brains are shaped by our loving relationships. I Love You Rituals are activities that provide unconditional acceptance, sensory integration, caring touch and messages of hope for children. They also decrease power struggles, and increase cooperation!

I Love You Rituals can be done when you are changing someones diaper for example. It can be as small as a bear hug or high five, or you can sing the Twinkle Twinkle song. "Okay Sue, We are going to change your diaper, but first would you like a bear hug or to sing the Twinkle Twinkle song?" Then do the activity and change their diaper.

Home to School Connection

At school we are often focusing on fostering independence with the children. We want to try and encourage the children to try something before we jump in to help them or do it for them. An example of this is in the classrooms the children have job charts. Here are some thoughts on Raising a helper...

Raising a helper:

INSTEAD OF:

NOT ALLOWING YOUR TODDLER DO SOMETHING BECAUSE IT COULD MAKE A MESS OR YOU CAN DO IT BETTER OR FASTER.

TRY THIS:

TAKING A DEEP BREATH AND REMEMBERING YOUR TODDLER IS MOTIVATED TO HELP, LEARN AND EXPLORE NOW IN THIS MOMENT.

Allowing your toddler to help today creates a child excited to help tomorrow!

Raising a helper:

TODDLER TIP

YOU CAN NURTURE YOUR CHILD'S NATURAL DESIRE TO HELP IN THE EARLY YEARS TO BUILD LIFELONG HABITS.

PRACTICE INVITING YOUR CHILD INTO AN ACTIVITY BY GIVING THEM A TASK THAT THEY ARE EXCITED ABOUT AND CAPABLE OF THAT THEY CAN DO ALONGSIDE YOU. IT'S NEVER TOO EARLY TO START.

Raising a helper:

TODDLER TIP:

YOU MAY BEGIN TO WORRY ABOUT THE MESS IS MAY CAUSE OR THE EXTRA TIME IT WILL TAKE FOR YOUR TODDLER TO HELP BUT SHUTTING DOWN THEIR EXCITEMENT TO BE CURIOUS AND EXPLORE NOW WILL CREATE A SCHOOL AGED CHILD THAT IS LESS CURIOUS, LESS WILLING TO TAKE RISKS, AND LESS EXCITED TO HELP LATER ON.
