- 1. Email the class with plenty of time in advance. I told them it would be by 5 p.m. the night before. Let them know they will need to be connected to the internet and logged in to Canvas.
- 2. In your Canvas class, select Collaborate Ultra.
- 3. Select Create Session.
- 4. Give the session a name.
- 5. Leave the shaded area with the anonymous dial in alone. It is preset to work with students.
- 6. Set the class Start and Stop time in the event details.
- 7. Click Save.
- 8. Then just enter the meeting when you are ready to begin.
- 9. When students open the slides, they can use the split screen feature in windows to view slides and lecture.
