Framework for Digital Accessibility

T—Train

Build foundational knowledge of accessibility principles and tools.

- ❖ Complete [UWSP accessibility training](#)
- ❖ Review [UWSP](#) and [Universities of Wisconsin](#) policies

R—Remove

Eliminate outdated or unused course materials.

- ❖ Use TidyUP to delete unused content
- ❖ Audit your course for content that is outdated or unnecessary

A—Adjust

Revise existing materials to meet accessibility standards.

- ❖ Run UDOIT in Canvas to identify accessibility issues
- ❖ Choose your remediation path:
 - Apply what you learned in the UWSP accessibility training
 - Follow along with CITL's Canvas course - *Title II: Bite-sized Remediation Guide* for step-by-step support

C—Create

Develop new content with accessibility in mind from the start.

- ❖ Use accessible templates and tools
- ❖ Follow best practices for multimedia and documents
- ❖ Test content with accessibility checkers

K—Keep Monitoring

Continuously evaluate and improve accessibility efforts.

- ❖ Run UDOIT before the start of each term
- ❖ Stay updated on evolving standards and tools
