2018 Wisconsin Lake Stewardship Award Winners

Lake Association of White Lake ~ Group (Single Lake)

Formed in 1999, the Lake Association of White Lake is an exemplar of how to bring their entire community into the important work of protecting and preserving the lake that serves as a centerpiece of the community. Nearly entirely membership funded, the Lake Association of White Lake's list of accomplishments is impressive--and too long to list here. They participate in shoreland restoration projects, aquatic invasive species monitoring and eradication, water monitoring, advocate for ordinances benefiting their lake, and various educational projects, including Clean Boats, Clean Waters and their very successful Adopt-a-Lake program.

Harold Resch ~ Youth/Educator

Soon after purchasing property on Lake Metonga in 2004, it became crystal clear to Harold that the future health and well-being of Lake Metonga was dependent on the youth of the area, so he set about educating them on the importance of environmental stewardship and the dangers that threaten a lake's ecosystem. In 2004, he created an essay contest for 5th and 6th graders in area school districts, asking them to write about their experiences with lakes and rivers in Forest County. He also organizes the Environmental Day Field Trip, giving area high school students a hands-on learning opportunity, teaching them about aquatic invasive species, fish population management, and boating safety.

Lakescape Solutions LLC/Nick Homan ~ Business

Since it's inception, Lakescape Solutions, LLC and it's owner/founder Nick Homan have been focused on finding shoreland restoration and landscape solutions for lake homeowners that both protect lakes and enhance the home's beauty. Nick exhibits at, helps plan, and offers assitance to students wishing to attend the Lakes Convention. In 2014 Lakescape Solutions, LLC completed the Lakeshore Habitat Restoration Program. One of Lakescape Solutions first goals is to share with the public the public the fragility of our water ecosystems, and the importance of protecting our lakes and waterways through thoughtful design and installation of restoration projects.

Manitowoc County Lakes Association ~ Group (Multiple Lakes/Regional)

Formed in 1997, the various founding stakeholders adopted this mission: "The Manitowoc County Lakes Association will protect and enhance the quality of area lakes and watersheds for the benefit of all." Over two decades, MCLA has provided a voice for all the water resources large and small in the county, and provided an important conduit between property owners and lake users. They partnered with county sportsman clubs, led shoreline restoration projects, and worked to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Perhaps their most important work, though, is the work they do to inform their fellow county residents about the importance of sound stewardship of their lakes.



2018 Wisconsin Lake Stewardship Award Winners

Derek Kavanaugh ~ Public Service

As the soil conservation and lake specialist for Green Lake County Land Conservation Department, Derek is a passionate partner for various lake organizations and associations in Green Lake County as they work to improve lake quality. Derek's knowledge and enthusiasm while serving on the Green Lake County Lake Management Planning Team has helped the county secure multiple grants for the county. More than only an advisor, Derek's technical knowledge has been crucial in protecting county waterways for phosphorus pollution. In addition, he is a long time board member of Wisconsin Lakes, and a graduate of the Lake Leader Institute.

Waldo Peterson ~ Citizen

Waldo Peterson's family has been a fixture on Mirror Lake since 1922, and since 1985 Waldo has been a fixture in the efforts to preserve and protect it. In 1986, after leading an effort to oppose a marina being built on the lake, Waldo helped found the Mirror Lake Association, serving as it's vice-president until 1992, when he moved into the role of president. When the Mirror Lake Management District was formed in 2006, his fellow district property owners elected Waldo to the commissioner position he still holds today. He has worked tirelessly in the effort to improve Mirror Lake and surrounding water bodies, forging partnerships with Lake Delton, Mirror Lake State Park, and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources on projects that have brought multimillion dollars in grant funding to the Mirror Lake area, enhancing the area's tourism potential while improving the water quality of Mirror Lake, Lake Delton, and Dell Creek.

Dr. Stephen Carpenter ~ Lowell Klessig Memorial Prize

Stephen Carpenter's career has exemplified the interdisciplinary approach to science and natural resource management that Lowell Klessig felt was so important. Dr. Carpenter has steadily pushed the envelope for new thinking and different approaches to problem solving, whether exploring ways to bring the concepts of ecological resiliency to human communities around lakes, or advocating for the inclusion of arts in the National Science Foundation's Long Term Ecological Research sites. His legacy has further ensconced Wisconsin as the premier place to study inland lake problems and future generations will benefit from not only Stephen's work, but also the work of many researchers and managers he has influenced.
