

Telling Your Story

- You know the story, but they don't!
- Keep your audience in mind- what stories are they interested in?
- Remain on track don't beef it up
- Be specific and to the point
- Have a reviewer check your work



Grants that Work

Forest Fest from Trees for Tomorrow wrote to Lumberjack: "Forest Fest, a community outreach event, will introduce students, families & other attendees to all the forest has to offer and **enhance our natural resources** by creating awareness for forestry, sustainability, conservation, and the positive impacts of outdoor, hands-on education..."

The application also gave bullet points to outcomes with "promoting a higher standard of living and improving quality of life" bolded.

The Prairie Enthusiasts wrote to Besadny: "The Prairie Enthusiasts acquired Mukwonago River Oak Barrens in June 2025. This 61-acre site is arguably the best example of sand barrens habitat in Waukesha County, and especially rare for Southeast Wisconsin."

They were looking for funds to help restore these communities.

Recordkeeping, Closeout, Audits

- You must have a good recordkeeping system
- Closeout promptly
- Do you need a financial audit?
 - Formal
 - Informal
- Programmatic/Compliance Audits
- Record retention requirements



Resources to Help

- Use AI to help you write
- Reach out to granting agencies
- Research grantors by looking at their IRS Form 990 to see what they have funded in the past
- Build relationships with your County Land+Water office
- Reach out to your membership or lake community to find out who might have experience with grants and who might be interested in helping or coordinating grant writing
- Consider partnering with another organization who has someone with the bandwidth to take on writing the grant application
