Learn to catch fish through a hole in the ice! Our day will begin at UWSP's nature reserve where we will have introductions and classroom basics before heading out to the ice.

You will learn about:

- Ice Safety
- Clothing and Safety Gear for Ice Fishing
- Gear: Jigging Rods, Tip-ups, Tackle, and Tech Gadgets

After lunch (provided) we will carpool to the current area fishing hotspots to meet your guides.

You will have the opportunity to:

- Check out - and fish from - different styles of ice houses
- Learn to to drill holes using different kinds of augurs
- Fish with live bait as well as lures
- Get tips and techniques for hooking and landing fish
- Handling fish - catch and release, or fish for the table
- Ask lots of questions and have lots of fun!
