BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION NO. 1-2005**

**Application for Registration of a School Forest Within the
School District of Butternut, Wisconsin**

WHEREAS, The School and Community Forest Law, section 28.20, Wis. Stats., enacted in 1947, allows schools, villages, cities and towns to own land and practice forestry; and

WHEREAS, THE Butternut School District owns the following forested parcels:
(1) Fifteen (15) acres in the SW1/4, NE1/4, Section 21, T41N, R1W, Town of Chippewa, Ashland County and (2) thirty (30) acres in the NW1/4, SW1/4, Section 28, T 41N, R1W, Town of Chippewa, Ashland County; and

WHEREAS, the School District of Butternut will use the property, known as the Butternut School Forest, to provide education on sustainable forestry; and

WHEREAS, an Educational Plan for the Butternut School Forest will be kept current, while promoting active and sustainable management of the Butternut School Forest; and


WHEREAS, these two parcels, that comprise the Butternut School District Forest, will provide networking and learning opportunities for teachers and students, to include but not be limited to, outdoor education activities and natural resources management; and


