Indigenous Cultures, Natural Resources, and Sustainability in Kenya

Study Abroad Course, Summer 2026

Approximate dates: June 7-27, 2025

The Kenya experience is divided into two components (non-SFE) and three (CNR SFE students):

1) Spring Seminar, 1 credit (NRES 479)

Mondays, 4-5:50pm, starting the Monday after spring break (8 weeks)

This orientation provides background information to help prepare students for the Kenya experience. It also provides an opportunity for students to get to know each other and to prepare logistically for the trip. **This seminar is required for all students traveling to Kenya.**

2) Kenya Study Abroad course (Indigenous Cultures, Natural Resources and Sustainability in Kenya), 3 credits: NRES 475/675

Dates: 3 weeks, starting the beginning of June (after CWES) (approx. June 7-27, 2026)

Take a once-in-a-lifetime trip to Kenya! This hands-on field course will immerse you in Kenyan culture, staying in and interacting with communities and organizations focused on Permaculture and sustainability. Some of the projects we have worked on in the past include building and installing rainwater tanks, fuel-efficient stoves, cob structures, wood-fired ovens, & more; designing and installing aquaponics systems, woodlots, tree nurseries, compost systems, gardens, & more; Learning about Kenyan culture including language, food, and traditions.

3) CNR Summer Field Experience (CNR SFE) only, Central Wisconsin Environmental Station, 2 credits: NRES 475/675

Dates: 2 weeks immediately following the spring semester

CNR students participating in Kenya to satisfy their SFE requirement will attend a 2-week summer field course at the Central Wisconsin Environmental Station in Amherst Junction, WI. This field course will provide students with essential field techniques in forestry, soils, water, wildlife, and plant identification.

The Kenya study abroad course is open to students of any major. Both undergraduates and graduate students may participate. A limited number of students are able to complete the Kenya course and spring seminar as part of their Summer Field Experience.

Financial Aid:

2. Once accepted (you will be notified by email the first full week in November) through the pre-application, you will be required to fill out to complete a full application through the Office of International Education by December 1. See 'deadlines' below for more information.

Selection process & criteria:

- 1. GPA of at least 2.0 overall.
- 2. Space is limited for CNR SFE students. Students will be ranked based on their projected graduation date and GPA, to allow students that are graduating sooner and in good academic standing the opportunity to participate.
- 3. Total number of students participating in the program is limited to 15, this includes CNR SFE students. Non-SFE students will be ranked based on their projected graduation date and GPA, to allow students that are graduating sooner and in good academic standing the opportunity to participate.
- 3. Pass a campus and criminal background check after you are tentatively accepted.
- 4. All students need to attend and pass the Kenya spring seminar and CWES to participate in the study abroad portion of the program.

Dec 1, 2025 Passports need to be applied for, no exceptions.
