



Regulatory Oversight of Hemp Products by DATCP

This document is a resource to aid hemp growers and processors in understanding the variety of ways hemp and hemp products are regulated in Wisconsin. This resource does not cover every way in which hemp and hemp products are regulated, and obtaining legal counsel may be warranted in this rapidly evolving regulatory environment. The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) transferred regulatory authority for hemp production in Wisconsin to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) on January 1, 2022.

Depending on what you produce with the hemp, specific licenses, certificates, or other requirements may be necessary. This document provides an overview of regulatory authorities for hemp product quality and safety. This list is not all-inclusive and working with a legal professional can help ensure you are complying with necessary local, state, and federal laws.

Hemp Must Be Lawfully Produced

Hemp produced lawfully in Wisconsin must contain a total delta-9 THC content of 0.3% or below and is produced under:

- a hemp research pilot program, including but not limited to the former Wisconsin DATCP [Hemp Research Program](#) (hemp program)
- a [USDA hemp producer license](#), or
- a [state or tribal plan approved by USDA](#).

DATCP licensed Wisconsin hemp produced from 2018 - December 31, 2021. More information is available at <https://hemp.wi.gov>.

Hemp Labeling

DATCP has the authority to enforce Wisconsin hemp-specific labeling laws. Under the labeling laws ([Wis. Stat. § 94.55\(3m\)](#)), a person may not:

- Knowingly make an inaccurate claim about the content, delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol (delta-9 THC) concentration, quality, or origin of hemp or a hemp product in the course of transferring or selling the hemp or hemp product
- Knowingly sell at retail mislabeled hemp or hemp products.

Food

DATCP has the authority to enforce Wisconsin's food safety and labeling laws to protect public health and safety, to prevent fraud and unfair competition, and to maintain a secure and abundant food supply.

DATCP may not consider a food to be adulterated solely because it contains hemp, as defined in Wis. Stat. § [94.67\(15c\)](#), or a hemp product. See Wis. Stat. § [97.02](#).

Authority on inspection of commercial scales used to weigh hemp seed and hemp products. DATCP adopts [National Institute of Standards and Technology \(NIST\) Handbook 44](#). Commercial scales must meet NIST requirements. See Wis. Admin. Code § [ATCP 92.02](#).

Pesticide Manufacturing, Sale, and Use

DATCP regulates manufacturing, sale, and use of pesticides in Wisconsin.

Pesticide products distributed in Wisconsin must:

- Register with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or have a Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) 25(b) minimum risk exemption
- Have a Wisconsin pesticide manufacturer and labeler license (this registers the product for distribution in the state)

DATCP has the authority to enforce against pesticide product violations.

Seed Labelers License

DATCP regulates and licenses seed labelers. The labeling requirement helps assure that consumers receive good quality seed that germinates and does not contain weed seeds.

A seed labeler is any business or person whose name appears on a seed label, or who opens containers of agricultural, lawn, or vegetable seed to sell all or part of it. Complete labeling requirements are listed in state law (Wis. Admin. Code § [ATCP 20](#)).

You do not need a seed label license if you sell:

- Seed grown and sold on your own farm
- Seed in unopened bags or containers labeled by a licensed seed labeler
- Clones
