Detoxification

Prolonged and extensive use of alcohol and/or drugs can lead to physical dependency and life threatening health problems. The Tellurian Detoxification Center is a 29-bed facility staffed by highly trained, credentialed professionals and is the first step in the road to recovery from substance abuse and alcohol. Wisconsin certified counselors meet individually with each patient to assist in determining the level of recommended treatment and expedite entry into treatment programs within the community. Patients at the Detoxification Center are medically monitored by a Registered Nurse (RN), who is supervised by a Board Certified Physician MD specializing in addictionology. The Detoxification Center provides services to multiple counties treating more than 5,000 clients per year through both voluntary and involuntary placements. The Detoxification Center operates twenty-four hours per day 365 days per year.

- We provide a safe withdrawal from alcohol and drugs
- We provide detoxification that is both humane and protects the patients dignity
- We prepare the patient for ongoing treatment for their substance abuse problem

608.223.3311 tellurian.org The Tellurian Detoxification Center provides Detox services for opiate addiction and withdrawal symptoms resulting from drugs such as Heroin, Oxycodone, Oxycontin, and Vicodin. Because opiate addiction can often result in more severe and prolonged withdrawal symptoms than alcohol withdrawal, opiate detoxification is limited to no more than 4-beds in the facility due to the increased amount of staff time required to treat and monitor opiate withdrawal.

Though the length of stay at the Tellurian Detoxification center varies, the average length of stay for most patients is 72 hours or less. Opiate withdrawal can and does often take longer to fully cleanse the body of any opiates and some patients experiencing opiate withdrawals may choose a longer length of stay.

As part of the detoxification process and treatment protocol, Wisconsin state certified counselors meet individually with each patient to assist in determining the level of recommended treatment and expedite entry into treatment programs within the community.
