

An Itinerary for Iceland: Ring Road Tour September 10-20, 2026

Embark on an unforgettable adventure along Iceland's famous Ring Road, a 1,322 km (820-mile) journey that circles the island and showcases its most breathtaking scenery—from thundering waterfalls and towering glaciers to volcanic landscapes, mountain passes, and dramatic fjords. This tour blends outdoor exploration, awe-inspiring geologic wonders, delicious Icelandic food and drink, and rich culture and folklore. You'll experience the classics of the Golden Circle, South Coast, and Reykjavík while also escaping the crowds to discover the stunning north and east.

Trip Leaders: Sue Kissinger and Heidi Einarsdottir Trip is limited to 23 people.

Wednesday, September 9, 2026 - Departure

- Depart US and fly overnight to arrive in Keflavík (KEF), Iceland very early Thursday morning to begin your adventure (flights not included).
 - · If you would like to arrive in Iceland a few days early or stay later, Heidi can assist you with that!

Thursday, September 10, 2026 - Ease Into It!

- Heidi will meet us at the airport and take us to breakfast at Viking World Museum
- Tour Þingvellir National Park
 - A true Icelandic treasure and the heart of the Golden Circle. Pingvellir is a UNESCO World Heritage site that is the site of Iceland's ancient parliament, the Alþingi (one of the 1st democracies in the world!) and where the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates are visibly pulling apart.
- Lunch and tour of Friðheimar Tomato Farm
 - · A unique tomato greenhouse and restaurant that grows its crops using geothermal energy. They also breed Icelandic horses so you will have the opportunity to learn about these amazing animals.
- Visit Skálholt Cathedral
 - · Skálholt is one of Iceland's most historical places as the country brought christianity into the young nation.
- Stay overnight at Hotel Geysir
- Breakfast and lunch included, dinner on own.

Friday, September 11, 2026 - Geysirs and Foss

- Breakfast at hotel
- Tour the Geysir Geothermal Area
 - · Witness the power of the geothermal activity in Iceland by walking through the paths at Geysir.
- Explore the beauty and power of Gulfoss, the Golden Waterfall
 - · One of the most popular waterfalls in Iceland. Gullfoss is a two-tiered cascade that plunges into a narrow canyon creating a dramatic effect.
- Soak in ancient pools of Hrunalaug
 - The warm (100°F) geothermal, mineral rich, natural pools at Hrunalaug allow you to relax in the beauty of Icelandic nature. The original pool was built in 1890 and the farm has been in the same family since then.
- Stay overnight at Hotel Geysir
- Breakfast included, lunch and dinner on own.

Saturday, September 12, 2026 - Explore the South Coast

- Breakfast at hotel
- Hike behind the majestic, 200' tall Seljalandsfoss
- Explore (from above and below) the 197' Skógafoss
- Hike to Kvernufoss
 - · A 97 foot gem hidden away in a magical gorge.
- Visit **Reynisfjara**
 - Also known as the Black Sand Beach, it is famous for its dramatic landscapes including basalt columns, sea stacks, and the Hálsanefshellir sea cave.
- Hike Fjaðrárgljúfur Canyon (1.5-2 miles)
 - A magnificent and massive canyon, about 300' deep that was carved by the River Fjaðrá.
- Stay overnight at Hotel Hunkubakkar
- Breakfast, lunch, and dinner included.

Sunday, September 13, 2026 - Glaciers!

- Breakfast at hotel
- Hike in Skaftafell National Park to Svartifoss (Black Falls)
 - A 1.8 mile hike to a stunning 60' waterfall that is beautifully framed by columnar basalt.
- Jökulsárlón (Glacial Lagoon) Boat Tour
 - Its breathtaking scenery, with blue icebergs, dramatic mountain backdrops, and abundant wildlife, makes it a must-see destination.
- Brewery tour and tasting at Horn Brewery.
- Stay overnight at Hotel Berjaya
- Breakfast and dinner included, lunch on own.



Monday, September 14, 2026 - East Coast Villages and Sites

- Breakfast at hotel
- Explore costal killages including Djúpivogur, Stöðvarfjörður, Fáskrúðsfjörður, and Seyðisfjörður
- Tour Petra's Stone Collection
- Dinner on own
- Stay overnight in Egilsstaðir at Lake Hotel
- Breakfast, lunch, and dinner included.

Tuesday, September 15, 2026 - Jewels of the North

- Breakfast at hotel
- Hike in the stunning Stuðlagil Canyon
- Explore Dettifoss
 - The most powerful waterfall in Europe wear your raincoats as you will get sprayed by the massive force! Optional hike to nearby Selfoss a beautiful cascading falls.
- Explore Mývatn area
 - · Hike Dimmuborgir
 - The unique geothermal and lava formations will make you feel like you've stepped into another world!
 - · Check out the unique Skútustaðagígar pseudo craters
 - · Explore Goðafoss
 - · The god waterfall, an historically significant and stunning waterfall.
- Stay overnight in Akureyri Hotel TBD
- Breakfast and lunch included, dinner on own.



Wednesday, September 16, 2026 - Beautiful Akureyri

- Breakfast at hotel
- Relax in the Forest Lagoon, one of the newest geothermal spas in Iceland
- Quick visit to Jólahúsið (the Christmas House)
- Free afternoon to explore Akureyri optional activities include:
 - · Akureyri Botanical Garden (free)
 - · Akureyri Art Museum
 - · Akureyri Swimming Pool
 - · Nonnahus Museum
 - · Whale Watching (several options)
- Stay overnight in Akureyri at Hotel TBD
- Breakfast included, lunch and dinner on own.

Thursday, September 17, 2026 - Sea Angling, Herring, and Beer

- Breakfast at hotel
- Morning of sea angling for cod on the North Atlantic with a tasty meal prepared on board (if you catch any fish)
- Guided tour of the Herring Era Museum
- Tour and tasting at the family owned Segull 67 Brewery
- Stay overnight at Hotel Siglunes
- Breakfast and lunch included, dinner on own.


Friday, September 18, 2026 - Heading South
