














# An Itinerary for Yosemite 2024 May 14 – 18, 2024

Join us to explore and experience the beauty of Yosemite National Park! See amazing sights such as a treasure trove of giant sequoia trees, beautiful waterfalls, towering rock faces, and some of the most incredible examples of natural beauty in the world. By van and by foot, learn about the park's geology, flora, and fauna.

#### **Tuesday, May 14, 2024**


- Our group meets early at UWSP to board vans headed to Minneapolis.
- The flight out of Minneapolis St. Paul International/Wold-Chamberlain Airport will take the group to Denver International Airport; the second flight will land at Fresno Yosemite International Airport.
- After landing, the group will board vans and head to <u>Tenaya Lodge at Yosemite</u> to check in, explore the resort, and prepare for the next three days.

## Wednesday, May 15, 2024

- Meet our <u>Yosemite Conservancy</u> naturalists at <u>Mariposa Grove Welcome Plaza</u>.
  - At the Mariposa Grove parking lot, there is a shuttle bus that will take the group two miles up the paved road to the Lower Grove. However, it is possible the shuttle will not be running yet and therefore the group would need to walk. The walk has about 600 feet of elevation gain. While in the Lower Grove, it is another mile walk to the Grizzly Giant for those who are interested.
- The group will then have the option to enjoy a hot sit-down lunch at the historic Wawona Hotel or have their carry-in lunch on the trail.
- Next, we will continue to the **Yosemite History Center** for a walk-through time in Wawona.
  - This half of the day will be focused on the rich cultural history in this area. There is a covered bridge and numerous historic buildings that have been brought there from all over the park. Also, there is a newly created Chinese Laundry exhibit.

## **Thursday, May 16, 2024**

- Meet our Yosemite Conservancy Naturalists at Yosemite Valley Lodge Amphitheater.
- Our group will split in half, going in different directions to Cooks Meadow and Lower Yosemite Falls.
- The groups will then return to Yosemite Valley Lodge Amphitheater at 12pm for lunch at the Base Camp Eatery or eat their carry-in lunch.
- Next, we will walk from Yosemite Valley Lodge to El Captain Meadow. This is a beautiful flat trail that is 3-4 miles. We can also drive those who would prefer to skip this trail.
  - Once the group comes back together, our naturalists will do a History of Climbing program with the entire group in the meadow while gazing up at the monolith.



#### Friday, May 17, 2024

- Meet our Yosemite Conservancy Naturalists at the Ahwahnee Hotel.
- We will walk together to **Mirror Lake** and **Tenaya Canyon**, on a paved bike path which is about 1 mile to Mirror Lake from the Ahwahnee Hotel. At Mirror Lake, the group can split into two with one naturalist doing a shorter distance and the other doing the whole 5-mile loop taking the entire day.
  - · At Mirror Lake we are under Half Dome, North Dome, Basket Dome, and Mt. Watkins, all while peeking into Tenaya Canyon. Tenaya Creek runs straight through the middle of this loop. The trail is rich in trees, woody shrubs, birds, and sometimes even wildflowers and wildlife!
- Our group will bring lunches to have on the trail (the group will be responsible for their own lunches).
- These hikes could take the entire day, or if we choose, we can walk the **Happy Isles Loop** or the **Valley Loop Trail** to make a circle back to the Ahwahnee Hotel.

#### Saturday, May 18, 2024

- After breakfast we will depart from Tenaya Lodge.
- If time allows we will try to get a hike in before we leave.
- Early afternoon we will check in at Fresno Yosemite International Airport.
- Our first flight will take us to Denver International Airport.
- A second flight will take us to Minneapolis St. Paul International/Wold-Chamberlain Airport.
- After landing, vans will take the group back to Stevens Point.



# What to bring

• Snacks, reusable water containers, backpacks, comfortable hiking boots/shoes, sun protection (hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen) clothing layers, rain gear, and swimsuit.

## Lodging:

Our group will stay in Tenaya Lodge premium patio rooms, complete with 2 queen beds, work desk with computer data port, WIFI, mini fridge and Keurig, cable TV and movies on demand, AM/FM clock radio, telephone in-room safe, iron and ironing board, blow dryer, climate control, and scenic patio with seating.

#### **Transportation:**

Transportation includes pick up and drop off from UWSP parking lot to every destination.
