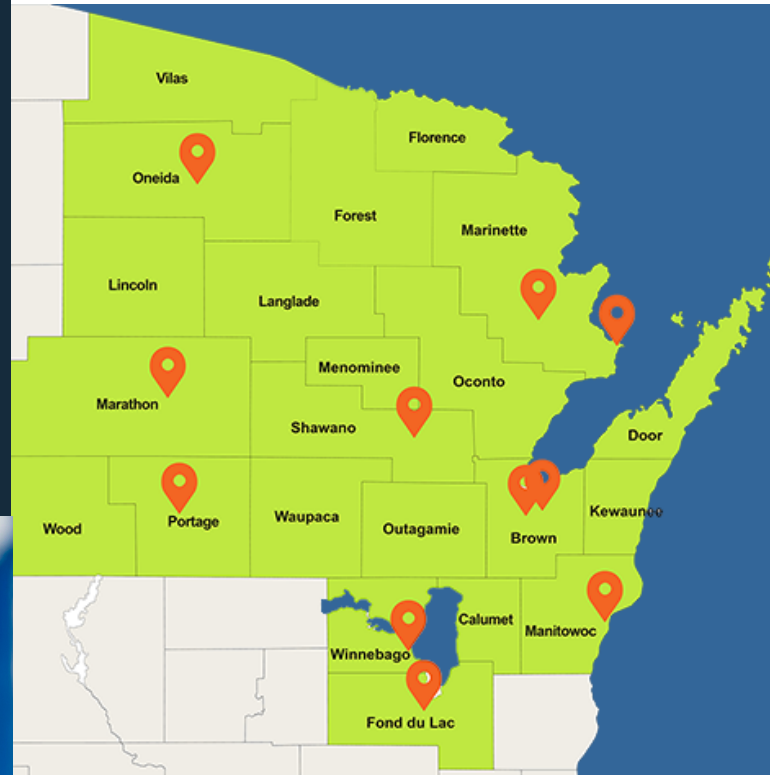

Who can become a member of the Family Care Program:

- An adult (age 18 or older) with a physical disability, developmental or intellectual disability, or be age 65 or older
- Financially eligible for Medicaid
- Have care needs that meet eligibility as determined by the State of Wisconsin

How to become a member?

Contact your local Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC). The ADRC will talk with you about your needs, the options that meet those needs, and eligibility requirements to enroll in the Family Care Program. Membership is voluntary.

Working with a Care Team

When you become a member of the Family Care Program, you will work with a team of professionals from Lakeland Care. This is your care team and it includes YOU and:

- Anyone you want to be involved, including family or friends;
- A Registered Nurse and Care Manager from Lakeland Care;
- Other professionals who may be involved depending on your needs.

Your Care Team will work with you to:

- Identify your strengths, supports, needs and preferences.
- Develop a care plan that includes the help you need.
- Ensure that the services Family Care provides meet your needs and are cost-effective.
- Make sure the services in your plan are provided to you.
- Make sure your care plan continues to work for you.
