## UWSP Native Youth Science & Culture Camp Rules and Regulations for Students

- The Native Youth Science and Culture (NYSC) Camp is not for all students. It is designed for students who have goals and academic ambitions. We will have fun and make this a memorable experience, but students who do not want to complete the schoolwork or have trouble obeying the rules will be removed from the program.
- 2. Students may not wear sunglasses, hats, headphones, or earbuds in class. They may not bring cell phones to class.
- 3. At 3 p.m. students are under the supervision of the program counselors. They must know where you are always. If you want to go somewhere off-campus, ask a counselor for permission and do not go alone.
- 4. Students who fail to obey the program counselors may or may not be given one additional chance. If they continue to disobey any of the program staff or commit a serious judgement error, they will be sent home.
- 5. The program counselors will inform you of the dormitory-living rules. These are university rules. Failure to follow them could result in your removal from the program.
- 6. Male and female students will be house on separate dormitory floors. Male students may not visit the female floor for any reason. Likewise, female students may not visit the male floor for any reason. The counselors will lead joint activities in public areas.
- 7. Students must bring clothing acceptable for all weather; we will be outside. Students are expected and encouraged to fully partake in cultural activities.
- 8. Everyone in the program should respect each other's privacy, possessions, and need for quiet time and personal space, even if you are roommates.
- 9. Family members or friends may come to visit you, but you must tell a program counselor before their arrival. All guest must sign in at the front desk of the residence hall.
- 10. All students are expected to remain on campus for the entirety of the program. Students may go home only in an emergency.
