


#### The Milwaukee Brewers of 1901

When the National League eliminated four teams in 1901, it opened the door for a second league to be born, the American League. Ban Johnson, President of the minor Western League, placed teams in cities that the NL had shunned, and more teams were placed in NL cities to set up rivalries. With all this moving around, only two cities survived from the Western League, Detroit which was about to have a boom thanks to the Automobile Industry, and Milwaukee which was years away from being a Major League city. Almost from the start of the season, plans were underway to relocate the 'Brewers', resulting in the club finishing dead last with a 48-89 record. The 'Brewers' would move on to St. Louis the following season, and become the St. Louis 'Browns'. 52 years later, they became the Baltimore 'Orioles'.

Milwaukee would have to wait until 1953 to get another Major League team, when the NL's 'Braves' moved from Boston. After the 'Braves' left Milwaukee for Atlanta, leaving the city without a team again in 1966, the 'Brewers' were reborn in 1970. Ironically the 'Brewers' moved from Seattle ('Pilots') after just one season as had the original Milwaukee 'Brewers', 68 years earlier.

The team played at Lloyd Street Grounds, located on Milwaukee's north side at the corner of Lloyd and 16th Streets. Future Hall of Famer Hugh Duffy was the player/manager of that squad, while five players were Wisconsin natives: Ed Bruyette (Manawa), Davy Jones (Cambria), George McBride (Milwaukee), Pink Hawley (Beaver Dam) and Pete Husting (Mayville).
