DATELINE: OCTOBER 4th, 1957

The Soviets had orbited the world's first artificial satellite. Anyone who doubted its existence could walk into the backyard just after sunset and see it.'

On a Friday, in October of 1957, the Soviet Union did just that by launching and orbiting **Sputnik 1**. The 'Space Race' was off and running. The satellite was the size of a basketball and weighed approximately 180 pounds. It traveled at 18,000 mph, 500 miles above the Earth's surface. It orbited the Earth every 98 minutes, flying over the United States seven times a day. Sputnik remained in orbit until **Jan. 4**, **1958**, when it re-entered and burned up in Earth's atmosphere.
