# FINANCIAL AID VOCAB CHEAT SHEET



Financial aid has a language all its own – one with lots of acronyms and industry-specific terms that can sound scary. This glossary will take some of the mystery out of these terms and help you make the best decisions about your financial aid offer.



# Student Aid Index (SAI):

An index number that your college's financial aid office uses to determine how much federal student aid you are eligible for. This number is not a dollar amount of aid eligibility or what your family is expected to provide.

### Cost of Attendance (COA):

An estimate of how much it costs to attend a college. The COA includes the price of tuition and fees, housing and meals, books and supplies and other expenses associated with attending that school. Learn about our COA here.

### Financial need:

The difference between the Student Aid Index (SAI) and a college's Cost of Attendance (COA).

### Net price:

How much it will cost you to attend a school for one year after your scholarships and grants are subtracted from the COA.



# FAFSA Submission Summary:

This report shows you what you reported is on your FAFSA, some information about the aid for which you may be eligible and your Student Aid Index (SAI). See a sample FAFSA Submission Summary here.

# Subsidized loan:

A need-based loan on which you don't pay interest while you're enrolled at least half-time in school.

## <u>Unsubsidized loan</u>:

A loan for which you don't have to demonstrate financial need, but you're responsible for the interest.

## Scholarship/Grant:

A monetary gift that doesn't have to be repaid. This can be one-time or renewable, and based on grades, talents, or other criteria.

### Work-study:

A need-based award for students to apply for a parttime job and earn a bi-weekly paycheck.
