Dearest Folks,

It is monday evening - the begining of the next to last week - my but the time has gone fast here. wednesday and thursday we have our big (and only) find. after that we will have some lectures but most of the time will be spent killing same. etc.

This last week has been really quite cool here. it feels like colorado weather - cool nights. Thursday morning it was exceptionally cool here, some of the fellas who just came up from a station in GEORGIA wouldnt get out of bed till we closed the windows - we soon fixed that by pulling them out of bed and giving them a cold shower.

It certainly was good to hear all of your voices again yesterday - also the folks and the cousins. It certainly sounded as if you were close by. the telephone does as well -.

Saturday after noon when I played volleyball for a couple hours then I lay in the sun here at the beach. After taking a shower my leg started to feel sore but it wasnt



so hot as to burn them to dryly. Saturday night I spent the time pasting the photos in my album and I started to letter the different ones. It is good to look thru the pictures we took while I was home. I also put the pictures of the Sutton and those I took in S.F. Then of course I sent some pictures of Janice.

Sunday morning I went to Chapel here at the base - the new Chaplin wasn't bad, I guess just mediocre they had some good music there tho - it was fine.

In the afternoon I again lay out in the sun for about 3 hours and my tan legs are now quite tan, if it is good next week and I shall probably do the same.

I wish I was there ~~to~~ show in your excitement but I am getting a lot of it from here. (an antidote to hear the word.)

I stand another 9 hour watch tonight - rather in the morning from 0400 till 0800 so I shall stop and get some sleep. I am looking forward to hearing from you and more details -
