



MERRY CHRISTMAS MOTHER

17 DECEMBER 1944
SUNDAY EVENING

Dearest Folks,

It is Sunday - a hot Sunday for this time of year. As I came on watch this evening I stopped to read the temperature - the thermometer on the wall of this quonset hut read 98° F. And as I came on into the hut I wondered what it was like in Colorado Springs. Certainly the temperature was different. I wondered if today was one of those cold crisp Colorado Days - when Pike's Peak shines out so brilliantly (58) in her new coat of snow. I pictured the family coming home from church at noon, and instead of taking a shower as I did to cool off, Richard built a fire in the fire place. At times things like snow, fire places, and cold weather, seem quite remote. It is hard to picture that type of weather, here where each day is the same, except it seems to rain a little longer or get a little warmer. Often I have wondered how a missionary would go about telling the natives in a climate like this about

snow. It would be interesting to see something like that done.

This past week has been good in a lot of ways. Now we are quite settled down to the same routine which shall be followed here - as long as we remain. aside from standing my watches here in the hut I have spent my time building lockers - which we will use for our personal things. Also we have been painting; and oiling the decks of the huts. (I didn't mean painting and oiling the decks - rather painting period - and oiling the decks - does it make sense to you - I hope so). Along about the middle of this next week we shall move from our cots to double deck bunks. They should be more comfortable and will also provide for more room. Our recreation hut is now complete - ping pong table (yes way out here) radio & record player - also chess and games like that. Plus a dozen soft balls, bats and gloves, foot balls, horse shoes, wolly ball, water polo ball, punching bag, boxing gloves - so you see our recreation gear is really complete. It helps a lot to have it too for it prevents idle hours for a lot of the fellows, that could be a big problem.
