It is a good quiet Sunday afternoon out
here in the equipment hut. They have been playing
symphonic records over the radio and the music
was very restful. Another bombing relief will
come out and I shall go over and eat supper with

you. This has been a good end to another good
week here on Saipan. I have been thankful for my
this past week for I have felt that it has done me
me a lot of good in many ways. I have learned
a lot about different human reactions under varying
conditions and I hope I shall be better because of them.

On Monday a couple of the other R, T, C and I
very self decided to paint the outside of the hut.
We wanted to experiment with it, trying to make it look
so we painted it white. We have an air compressor, new
paint spraying rig and all the additional paraphernalia (P.P.)
that was necessary so after lunch we turned to and
by 4:00 it was done. I did most of the spraying
and as there was a good wind I really got covered
with specks of paint. I made the mistake of only not
wearing a pair of shorts, and rather than the paint
landing on the clothing it got all over me. Oh well
I don't mind at least I got all of pictures taken.

some 80 octane gasoline plus a lot of rubbing and scraping we managed to get it off.

Painting the gunner's hut white has really helped too for it is about 5 degrees cooler inside, and that means a lot. You see there has to be three fellows on watch here all the time - a Radioman, our radar man and also a R.T. They have to stay here for 4 hours so during the day it can get quite hot inside and there will be only trouble with spraying the paint so that it took almost as long to clean out the various boxes, magazines and lets that we used.

During the week I managed to get away for a few hours and I went up to the B-29 base. While there I talked with the crew of the B-29 that the Russians shot down. You probably heard about it in the papers. It seems that they were flying P.W. supplies to some Australians in Manchuria and while enroute from Russian planes approached them and waved for them to land. The B-29 crew could have opened fire at them but didn't, and a little later the Russians started firing on the B-29, because they wouldn't land. The B-29 started heading back toward the sea but the one of their engines was shot up so they had to jump. When they were picked up and taken to the place where the 29 had crashed they found a Russian engineer piecing them the week, and they learned that he knew more about the plane than did the crew members. The crew were held for interrogation and the U.S. was notified. While waiting for the Col. from here to arrive they took

This past week we have been experimenting with a different watch schedule. Up until last Sunday we have been standing 4 hours on and 12 off - on and on. Well it was getting rather tiresome - the routine of it and all. So last Sunday I took and I decided to think up something different and here is the new watch we stand. Every night one tick stands the watch all night (we have a cat here and are able to get some sleep off and on) that means he is on for 12 hours. When he gets off watch then he is off for 32 hours. Then back on for 4 - off for 16 - on for 4 and off for 16 again.

back on for 4 and off for 8 hours again. Then we go on the 12 hour all night watch again. Under the new set up we get three full nights of sleep out four, and that really helps a lot. I have never become accustomed to getting up different hours of the night and then trying to sleep in the day time and talk with others.

Our Chapel service this morning was good. The attendance has been small altho there has been ^{now} a turn over since the different out fits that come together in the place we meet. Chaplin Haigal has meant a lot to us working to be but ^{all} the feller who attend Chapel our there ^{now} imagine that in another month he will be going home for he is 45 and has over 8 paintings up.

It's my best September certainly is going fast. So far the time out here has really gone by rapidly and I am glad. I feel that a great deal concerning the speed which time passes here depends on the individual and the ^{or} attitude one takes.

I think well my relief is here ~~now~~ as I had better stop now. I will go over and get a bite to eat and drink then write a letter to Janice. Oh yes I am enclosing some negatives. You too and write again all of the time & of us - It's a ^{lot} of fun of us here.
