The most interesting history of the state of Wisconsin by R. G. Thwaites, secretary of the State Historical Society was clipped with the kind permission of the author from the State Gazetteer and may be doubly welcome to our people on account of next year's Semi Centennial celebration of our state. The canvass in the city and the villages of Amherst, Amherst Junction, Nelsonville, Junction City, Plover, Whiting and Sherman was made in an able and efficient manner by Mr. A. A. McIntyre and Mr. C. H. Gothia and the faithful and intelligent work they have done lies now before the people, and commends itself favorably for its completeness, accuracy and intelligence. A personal canvass of McDiill was not taken, as the same is fully covered in the information for the town of Plover.

We have exercised the utmost care in making this directory. Special pains were taken in the correct spelling of names, and wherever an error in this line appears in this work it certainly is more the fault of the bearer of such names

than ours. Many people have either by their own negligence for years permitted the use of a misspelled name and adopted the same in the course of time as their own, or they have without good reason changed the name which came to them by honorable parents.

Great difficulty was experienced in the city of Stevens Point in regard to the street numbers. Some years ago the United States government caused the streets to be numbered on the Philadelphia plan, of 100 numbers to the block. Owing to the fact that the streets do not run parallel with each other, there are many wrong house numbers, and an official renumbering throughout the city therefore seems advisable. We succeeded in influencing the mayor and city council to take prompt action in the changing of a number of names of streets, which appeared more than once in different sections of the city or of continuous streets bearing different names. The street names thus changed are:

Point street, the continuation of Minnesota ave., bears now the name of Minnesota ave.

Martin street, is called now Michigan ave., as it was the continuation of the latter.

North Center street is now called North Third street, being the continuation of same.

The name of Cross street on the west side was changed to Karner street in honor of ex-mayor S. E. Karner, who now ably fills the position of president of the council. There is another Cross street on the east side near the fair grounds.

The alley between Smith and Union streets, south of Sixth avenue, where a great number of people reside, was christened Smith place.

There were two George streets and the one in the Fourth ward was therefore named Georgia street.

In order to make a distinction between the three River streets they were called according to their locations. North River street, South River street and West River street.

There was, aside from Division street, a South Division street in the city and as Division street south of Main street is officially called Division street south, complications often arose out of the similarity of names. The street nomenclature therefore was changed to Park street in honor of our worthy fellow citizen, B. B. Park who, as mayor, member of the board of normal school regents and district attorney, distinguished himself as one of the staunchest promoters of the welfare and growth of our city.

Fremont street was extended to the Jordan road.

The state census taken one year ago gave Stevens Point a population of 9,004. The growth of the population of the city has since taken its onward course. The city directory

of 1894 contained about 3500 names of people over 16 years of age. The present directory submits to its patrons the names of 4068 residents of Stevens Point over 16 years old. All publishers of city directories claim  $2\frac{3}{4}$  inhabitants to one name as a very conservative calculation. As this would show a population of 11,188 in the city there must have been either an incorrect census canvass taken or the city has wonderfully increased during the last year. However, we will base our calculation on a smaller rate, namely, one directory name to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  people, and with this we arrive at the conclusion that Stevens Point has now entered for a certainty into the ranks of the cities of 10,000 population and over, because the total of this computation is a city population of 10,170.

In the first part of this work the histories of Wisconsin, Portage County and Stevens Point are printed, followed by an exhaustive postal information, a list of the county, city, judicial and school officers, of the churches and clergymen, the church and civic societies and the directory of the streets of the city of Stevens Point. This is followed by a description of the abbreviations used throughout the work and the corrections and additions which were reported while the book was being printed. The second part of the work opens with an alphabetically arranged list of all residents over 16 years excepting wives, in the city and the villages of the county. We do not claim that this work is without error but we feel certain that it is reasonably correct. Following this a directory of the different towns is presented, in which only the tax payers are mentioned with the description of the premises they occupy and naming their postoffice address. This is supplemented by a classified business directory of Portage county, in which the various vocations are arranged alphabetically and under the heading for each pursuit are the names and addresses of all persons and firms in the county engaged in that particular calling. And last but not least we present the people a new map of our county. It will be seen that this map conforms to the changes in the boundary lines of the towns of Amherst, Sharon and Stockton which were ordered at the last session of the county board.

We hope that our enterprise will meet with a general support to reward us for our zealous endeavor to give our people a reliable city and (the first) county directory.

# Wisconsin.

Wisconsin is situated at the head of the chain of Great Lakes. It is touched on the east by Lake Michigan, on the north by Lake Superior, on the west by the Mississippi, and is drained by interlacing rivers which so closely approach each other that the canoe voyager can with ease pass from one great water system to the other. He can enter the continent at the Gulf of St. Lawrence and, by means of numerous narrow portages in Wisconsin, emerge into the south-flowing Mississippi and eventually return to the Atlantic through the Gulf of Mexico; or he can by way of the Mississippi, the Missouri and the Columbia, reach the Pacific ocean, as did Ramsey Crooks on the famous Astoria expedition of 1809. From Lake Michigan, the Fox-Wisconsin river system was the most popular highway to the great river. Into Lake Superior there flow numerous streams, from whose sources lead short portage trails over to the headwaters or feeders of the Mississippi. In their early voyages to the head of lake navigation, it was in the course of nature that the French should discover Wisconsin; and having discovered it, they soon learned that it was the key-point of the Northwest and the gateway to the mysterious "River of the Southern Sea." Thus the geographical character of Wisconsin became, very early in the history of New France, an important factor.

In 1634, Frontenac, then governor of New France, sent Jean Nicolet, a coureur de bois, into the then mysterious region of the Upper Lakes, to make treaties with the north-western tribes and induce them to trade with the French of Lower Canada. He ascended the Fox river as far as the present Berlin, then proceeded southward, overland, to Illinois, and reached Lake Michigan on his way home, probably by the Chicago portage. In 1658-9, Radisson and Groseilliers, two French fur traders, visited Green Bay and went up Fox river, and, probably, descended the Wisconsin and saw the Mississippi. In 1661 they were back again in Wisconsin, and built

nesses and massacred the fugitives. The country was, for a century and a half, the happy huntingground for the easy-going French—licensed traders and coureurs de bois as well—and in the French and Indian war was a favorite recruiting field for those disciplined bands of redskins who periodically broke forth upon the borders, filling the life of American pioneers with scenes of horror. It was Langlade, a Wisconsin leader of these savage allies, who caught Braddock in his slaughter pen (July 9, 1755) and whose swarthy followers bore away to the trans-Michigan woods a goodly share of the scalps and spoils won on that fateful day.

When New France fell, in 1763, Wisconsin—now made by George III. a part of the Province of Quebec—remained essentially French. The flag of England waved for a time over a rude military stockade at Green Bay, but the woods were filled with French and Indians, in all grades of blood relationship who had transferred their allegiance to the conqueror. French and half-bloods, throughout the war of the Revolution, wore the scarlet uniforms of His Majesty's army.

Although the Northwest was given to the United States in the treaty of 1783, the English were practically in military possession of Wisconsin until the close of the war of 1812-15. It was nominally in the Northwest Territory until 1800; then a part of Indiana Territory until 1809. Illinois Territory included Wisconsin until 1818, when Michigan Territory assumed control. When Wisconsin Territory came into being in 1836, it included also Iowa, Minnesota, and Dakota east of the Missouri and White Earth rivers. Parts of this domain were ceded to Iowa in 1838, and to Minnesota in 1849. Early in the present century congress excluded the British traders, and, to protect the agents of the American Fur Company, erected Fort Howard, opposite the French and Indian village of Green Bay, and Fort Crawford, at the fur-trading post of Prairie du Chien.

Up to this time the French and half-bloods still held Wisconsin woods and streams, and the fur trade was the chief industry. Little by little this French predominance was undermined, at first by the advent of Americans into the lead mines (1827), and then by agricultural settlers. The Black Hawk war (1832), wherein the Sacs and Foxes were cowed, was an important factor in the opening of the region to public view. American settlement and development along American lines now began in earnest. The fur trade ceased to be of

a stockade near where Ashland now is. In 1665 Father Alouez established a mission at La Pointe, on Chequamegon Bay near the fort of Radisson and Groseilliers, on the main land. It was not until the present century that the La Pointe mission was removed to Madelaine Island. Two years later, the Jesuit mission of St Francis Xavier arose at De Pere, at the first rapids in the Fox river. The Green Bay (or Bay des Puans) of the seventeenth century was not on the present site of that city, but at De Pere. The place became an important headquarters for the fur trade, although it was 1750 before permanent settlement was established—the Langlades being the pioneers. Joliet and Marquette passed through here in 1673, on their way up the Fox and down the Wisconsin, to explore the Mississippi. The following year Marquette coasted Lake Michigan, from Green Bay by Milwaukee, to the Chicago portage. A similar trip was made by La Salle in 1679, and it was among the islands of Green Bay that his vessel, the Griffin, was lost in a storm. The following year Du Luth, a famous French trader, voyaged from Lake Superior to the Mississippi river, by ascending the Bois Brule and descending the St Croix. Father Hennepin had, the same year, ascended the Mississippi as far as the site of Minneapolis, and on falling in with Du Luth, returned with him by the Wisconsin and Fox rivers, to Green Bay. In 1685, Nicholas Perrot, a fur trader, who had been at Green Bay as early as 1669, was appointed French "Commandant of the West," and built a stockade fort for the protection of his forest trade, on the Mississippi, near Trempealeau. In 1689 and later, Perrot established forts on Lake Pepin and at the mouth of the Wisconsin river, at Prairie du Chien. In 1692 Le Sueur built a stockade at La Pointe and also fortified an island in the Upper Mississippi, near Red Wing, so as to protect both ends of Du Luth's old fur-trade route. The Jesuit missions on Lake Superior and Lake Michigan soon played a prominent part in the history of American exploration; thus two and a half centuries ago, when the Puritan colonies on Massachusetts Bay were yet in their infancy, and long before the intervening country had been visited, the general geographical features of Wisconsin and the route thither were familiar to the French rulers at Quebec.

Wisconsin was notable, too, in those early days, as a hiding place for tribes of Algonkins, who had been driven beyond Lake Michigan before the resistless onslaught of the Iroquois. The latter, however, often ventured into these forest fast-



importance, the non-progressive French element subsided into insignificance, immigrants from the east were attracted by cheap lands on easy terms, and thenceforth Wisconsin was an American territory, which rapidly grew into a powerful and patriotic state. Racine was founded in 1834, Sheboygan in 1834, Kenosha in 1835, Milwaukee, Janesville and Oshkosh in 1836, Madison in 1837, Whitewater in 1839, La Crosse in 1840, Stevens Point in 1843, and Appleton in 1848.

In modern days, the state has advanced uninterruptedly in peaceful and profitable industries, growing into a great and powerful commonwealth. The war of secession drew from the farms and cities of Wisconsin an army of over 90,000 men for the defense of the Republic. Three-fourths of the people are either of foreign birth or parentage, 31 per cent being of foreign birth. Among the foreign born, there are 283,000 Teutons, 100,000 Scandinavians, 34,000 Anglo-Saxons, 33,000 Irish and 33,000 Slavs. There are large areas in the state, wholly populated by foreigners—the most important groups being German, Scandinavian, Welsh Swiss, and Belgian. It seems likely that the German-Scandinavian type will doubtless predominate here, making a fair and stalwart race. Although possessing this unusual preponderance of the European element, Wisconsin does not differ ethically from her sister states of the northwest, because the immigrants are in most ways thoroughly Americanized, making good citizens, intelligent voters and patriotic soldiers.

## Portage County.



By Hon. Geo. W. Cate.

**T**HE position of the territory known as Portage county early forced its recognition. Its central position on the map, the remarkable circumstances of two great rivers, one discharging its waters into the Gulf of St. Lawrence and the other into the Gulf of Mexico, passing so near each other within the county in their opposite courses that both rivers could be covered and passage thereby prohibited or controlled by a single military post. The fact that these two rivers and the land between them was part of a great highway of "the nations" the owners and occupiers of the country, considerations of settlement, protection and security compelled such recognition and furnished a name to a political division of the state. Two great rivers having their sources far apart, coming so near each other as to furnish an uninterrupted navigable pathway from the great lakes on the north to the Mississippi on the south, broken only by the narrow strip of land between them over which the voyager made his way on foot with his canoe upon his head. Hence the name, Portage, "A 'carry' between navigable waters." The Winnebagoes occupied the country and sold to traders the right to pass over the strip from one river to the other. It was the key to travel and traffic and became a trading post an hundred years ago before an American had settled elsewhere in the state.

On October 16, 1818, all the extent of country constituting the present state of Wisconsin was organized into two counties, Brown and Crawford. Brown county included all the country east of a straight north and south line through the center of the said portage between the Fox and Wisconsin rivers. On September 6, 1834, the county of Milwaukee was created out of Brown county and by an act approved by Gov. Dodge, December 7, 1836, the counties of Brown and Milwaukee were dissolved and new counties created therefrom. Section 5 of this act provided for Portage county as follows: "Township number 10 in range 6, township 10 in range 7,

townships 10 and 11 in range 8, townships 10, 11, 12, and 13 in ranges 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13, east of the 4th principal meridian shall be and hereby are constituted a separate county and be called Portage, and the seat of justice established at the town of Winnebago, being the same place as hereinafter called "Winnebago portage," almost the same territory afterwards stricken from Portage county and erected into Columbia county.

On February 18, 1841, a further act was passed relating to Portage county as follows: "Sec 1. All that district of country lying immediately north of the county of Sauk and the county of Portage as now (then) constituted, being ranges 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 east of the 4th principal meridian, shall be and the same is hereby annexed to and made a part of Portage county," and the act provides that the county officers shall hold their offices at "Wisconsin portage," being another name for the portage between the Fox and Wisconsin rivers; established election precincts at Bull Falls, Grand Rapids, and the house of Abraham Brawley on Mill Creek. All this large extent of territory, fully two hundred miles long by forty miles wide, was subsequently carved down and sliced away until only the present county remained to respond to the old name. For many years it was attached to Dane county for judicial purposes.

The first election for county officers was held on the fourth Monday in March, 1842, and the first meeting of the board of supervisors was on April 20, 1842, at the said Winnebago Portage, at the hotel of Capt. Gideon Low, and the first business transacted was to establish election precincts as follows: Winnebago portage, Mill Creek, Big Bull Falls, in the present county of Marathon, Grand Rapids in the present county of Wood, Dekorra in the present county of Sauk, and Columbus in the present county of Columbia. At this same meeting the county was divided into road districts as follows: No. 1, all that portion of the county lying north of an east and west line passing through the house of Jared Walsworth. Walsworth's house was sixteen miles north of Winnebago portage, and A. B. Sampson of Grand Rapids now in Wood county, was appointed road supervisor for that district reaching from Walsworth's to Big Bull Falls, now Wausau. The board of supervisors consisted of Henry Jones and Thomas C. Nelson, then of the southern portion of the county, and Andrew

Dunn of Mill Creek in the present limits of the county. All are now deceased. The election for Mill Creek, the only election precinct within the present limits of the county, was held at the saw mill of Andrew Dunn, and himself, Hugh McFarlane and Solomon Story were the judges of that election. McFarlane and Story are deceased.

At the same meeting commissioners were appointed to examine the country north for the purpose of opening a road to Plover portage on the Wisconsin river. The importance of early communication with the Upper Wisconsin and the lumber interests of that remote region was already fully appreciated. In 1826-7-8 Fort Winnebago had been constructed on the east bank of the Fox at Winnebago portage in this county and the lumber therefor brought down the Wisconsin. and in 1831 Daniel Whitney had built a saw mill at Whitney Rapids. In 1836 a saw mill was built at Grignon's Rapids near to and above Point Bausse, in the present county of Wood. These were the first mills for the manufacture of lumber built in the piny region within the county of Portage; but in 1836, for the purpose of encouraging improvement and occupation of the vast water power between Point Bausse and Big Bull Falls on the Wisconsin river and all within Portage county, the government obtained from the Indians a strip of land six miles wide and forty miles long, and the same was speedily surveyed and brought into market, the intention being, as far as practicable, to locate the strip three miles wide on each side of the river. So great was the desire of pioneer lumbermen to engage in the business that by the close of the year 1837 two mills were established at Grand Rapids, one on Mill Creek by Dunn & McFarlane and one by Hugh McGreer on the Big Plover where the Wadleigh mill now stands. These were the first mills built within the present county of Portage. In 1839 a saw mill was built at Big Bull Falls and the same or the following year a large mill for two single and two pairs of saws was commenced by John L. Moore at Little Bull Falls where the mills of the Dessert Lumber Co. now stand, and was speedily completed. The business, however, was prosecuted under great embarrassments arising out of the isolation of the timber and its place of manufacture from supplies, labor and provisions. The country adjacent was absolutely barren of such supplies; not a furrow had been turned. The supplies of provisions were brought by sleigh or wagon from Illinois and mainly from as far south as Dixon on Rock River,

over roads to which the road supervisor was a stranger. Portage was headquarters where lumbermen from above met the shippers from below and purchased supplies.

The principal business for county officers came from the "pinery." The country intermediate was an unbroken wilderness in the possession of Indians whose title thereto had not been extinguished and so it early began to be talked that it would facilitate the discharge of public business and economize expenses to move the county seat further north; at all events the meetings of the county board should be held nearer the center of business and population.

In the winter of 1843-4 proceedings were inaugurated looking to a location of the county seat by a vote of the people, and finally a vote was taken in April, 1844, which resulted in the location of the county seat at the place afterwards called Piover. In the following September an election was held in the county for the election of county officers, and Nelson Strong, then of Grand Rapids, was elected sheriff; George Wyatt, register and county clerk, and both qualified and entered upon the discharge of their judicial duties January 1, 1845. The last meeting of the board of county commissioners at Winnebago portage convened July 1, 1844, and the first meeting within the present limits of the county was held October 24, 1844. The first business was to audit accounts for surveying a road from Winnebago portage to Big Bull Falls, about one hundred and twenty five miles. B. F. Berry was chairman, a somewhat noted character of those times commonly called "Big Ben Berry," of Big Bull Falls. The county seat having been located, the question then was where to locate the county buildings. Moses M. Strong and Francis J. Dann of Mineral Point, probably anticipating what actually took place, purchased of the United States the east half of the south west quarter of section 22, township 23 north, in range 8 east, of the 4th principal meridian, and within the six mile limit; and proposed to the county that if the county buildings were located upon said tracts and a court house and jail erected thereon they would divide the same into lots, a public square in the center, and deed to the county every alternate lot. The proposition was favorably considered by the board and subsequently accepted by it. The place thus selected with the country immediately adjacent was at that time of rare beauty. A high burr oak prairie, the trees sparsely distributed over the ground, of short, bushy and branch-

ing top, reminding one of the old apple orchards of the country he had left behind him. Not thick enough to interfere with the range of the naked eye, the ground level, but sloping gently toward the Wisconsin river, scarcely a mile away to the west, covered with grass and absolutely free of brush or bushes by reason of the annual fires, silent, grand and beautifully peaceful, it seemed a fitting place for a temple of justice.

On October 24, 1844, the county board removed the voting place of Plover portage precinct from Conant's mills to the house of Houghton & Batton in Rushville. These men kept a tavern about twenty rods from the southeast corner of the piece of land selected for the county buildings and the immediate locality was called Rushville. The term Plover Portage did not mean a particular locality, but included the country known afterwards as Conant's Rapids, Stevens Point, the mouths of Big and Little Plover and the county seat.

At the same meeting the board appointed Nelson Strong and E. S. Miner, both of Grand Rapids, and Silas Walsworth of Winnebago portage a committee on "public buildings at Rushville," and instructed the committee to proceed without delay in constructing a court house and jail. But it was not until April 4, 1845, that the buildings were definitely ordered to be built on the land purchased by Strong & Dunn.

On July 9, 1845, the board called for proposals for building a court house "one and one-half stories high, square roof, and offices for the different county officers which the county is required by law to furnish, in a good, substantial, plain manner." William Dunton was the successful bidder, but the building was not completed so as to be occupied until the March term of the circuit court in 1849. Judge Larabee of Dodge county, was circuit judge.

The south end of the county was settling up rapidly and the people then were considerably incensed because of the location of the county seat so far north to accommodate, as they expressed it, a few transient people whose only object was "to cut and get away with the pine timber." This feeling led to the passage of an act dividing the county on the north line of township 13 north, thereby cutting off twenty-one townships constituting the present county of Columbia. By the subsequent creation of the counties of Adams and Waushara the present boundary on the south was established. On February 9, 1850, the county was divided by

erecting all that part of Portage county lying north of a line running east and west on the south line of township 26 and east of range 1 east, to the north boundary of the state, intersecting the Montreal river at the northeast corner of township 46, range 1 east, into the county of Marathon. In March, 1856, Portage county was again divided by the erection out of its territory the present county of Wood, and by the same act the boundaries of Portage county were established as the same now exist.

From the time of the removal of the county seat from Winnebago portage the business of lumbering rapidly increased. The county abounded in pine timber and good water power, to which the timber was easily accessible and saw mills were built on Mill Creek, Big Plover, the Wisconsin river at Conant Rapids and Stevens Point, and on the Little Eau Claire; and speedily the county became a large producer of manufactured lumber and shingles. There was no development in agriculture because, as already noticed, the entire county was owned and occupied by Indian tribes, jealous of the whites who now and then intruded upon their lands. Besides, the government kept its protecting arm about the Indians and was active in keeping the whites from permanently occupying their lands.

At the second session of the third legislative assembly which convened at Madison December 6, 1841, Portage county first appeared in the apportionment of representatives in the territorial legislation, and with Brown, Fond du Lac, Manitowoc and Sheboygan constituted an assembly district and was twice represented by Abraham Brawley of Portage county. At the first session of the state legislature, which convened June 5, 1848, Portage county was represented in the assembly by James M. Campbell of Stevens Point, and was in the second congressional district, then represented by Ben. C. Eastman of Grant county.

Portage county was placed in the western district for judicial purposes, presided over by United States District Judge David Irvin, and the first term of court in the county was held near the lands afterwards selected for the county buildings in an unfinished ware house belonging to John Curran, and near to a store kept by him, and donated for the occasion. The court convened on the last Monday in August, 1845. Present: David Irvin, judge; George W. Mitch-

ell now of Milwaukee, deputy United States marshal; Nelson Strong, sheriff, and George Wyatt clerk.

Sheriff Strong being out of the territory he appointed Geo. W. Mitchell under sberiff and Mitchell appointed William Fellows now of Mosinee, and a man named Wilder deputy sheriffs for the term. A grand jury was in attendance, some of whom had traveled an hundred miles for that purpose. It was an event looked forward to by the isolated population scattered in logging camps, at saw mills and shingle shanties remote from each other. A first term of court in a western county was an epoch. Everybody attended. Frequently camp fires were built and people sat about them all night. A load of people came from Madison, 125 miles, in a two-horse wagon to see the first term of court in the "pinery." All the possible elements of character were represented, from the "strictly temperate" to the "half seas over." By the time the grand jury had been duly sworn the latter were becoming prominent. One Robert Wakely, a man of high social qualities, whose good nature never forsook him even when drunk, rode his horse into the court room by the wide door, just to salute the stranger judge. Holding his hat off to the right of his head as in military salute, looking straight at the judge, a sweet smile lighting up his countenance, and softly singing that ancient lullaby commencing,

"Hush my babe, lie still and slumber,"

all the time forcing his horse along.

The judge was wild. He was recently from old Virginia, a man of great learning and a high appreciation of the law. He demanded the arrest of the intruder. Many thought it funny, and would pat Wakely on the back, but more frowned upon it. The marshal had stepped from the room and the deputy sheriffs were slow to act. Mitchell was sent for and he came and proved himself to be a man who not only knew his duty but had the nerve to do it, and speedily took Wakely from his horse and had him before the court. The result was that he was severely reprimanded and imprisoned in the marshal's bedroom a day or two, and then John Catlin of Madison, an old and highly respected citizen, obtained his release by reason of the many good qualities of Wakely.

But the term was of short duration. The clerk had been using a scroll in place of a seal for a seal, and a question was raised as to the validity of process so attested and the court ruled in favor of the objection. The judge then took a new

American quarter dollar and with his knife scratched off the date figures and adopted that as the seal of the court. These proceedings had occupied most of the second day and then the court was adjourned for the term.

Judge Irvin held two more terms in the county, 1846 and 1847, and none more were held until the advent of the state government. The state constitution was adopted by vote of the people on the second Monday in March 1848. The first session of the legislature was held in June, 1848, and provision made for the election of officers at the following general election in Portage county. Thomas H. McDill was elected sheriff; George W. Mitchell, clerk; and G. W. Cate, prosecuting attorney.

The county seat remained at Plover until removed by a vote of the people to the city of Stevens Point in 1868. Until the completion of the new court house courts were held in the Johnsen building situated on the north side of Main street and west side of the Public Square and just recently removed to Clark street by Capt. J. O. Johnsen. The new court house was completed and occupied for court purposes in 1871.

The treaty of Lake Poygan was signed on October 18, 1848, by which the Menominees ceded all their lands in Wisconsin to the United States government. These lands included all the entire country north and west of the Fox and Wolf rivers and east of the Wisconsin, and south of an east and west line from Conants Rapids east. The county of Portage was greatly benefited by the treaty in that it opened up to settlement almost its entire territory of agricultural lands, and although by the terms of the treaty the Indians had the right of occupation for two years, such provision proved no barrier to the occupation of the lands by the whites, and homesteaders speedily swarmed over the line and took possession of the country. Little effort was made to prevent the rush of squatters, so that in the ensuing season of 1849, farms were opened and settlements made in every part of the county.

The climate of the county is healthful. Good water is abundant. Streams are numerous. Through the center of the county north and south and mainly in ranges 9 and 10 the surface rises into high, broken, rocky ridges, being part of the "Great Divide" which separates the waters of this region seeking an outlet to the sea by the Great Lakes and the

St. Lawrence from those leading into the Mississippi. On the east side of this divide is the Waupaca river and numerous tributaries of never-failing pure water fed by springs which abound all through the valley of the Waupaca; also many lakes of living water of which the more important are Lake Emily, Lake Thomas, Lime lake and Oesterle lake, all of which are well stocked with good fish. The Waupaca river has good water power scattered along its course for several miles, the more valuable of which are now occupied by the flouring mills of Jerome Nelson and the Jackson Milling company in Amherst. On the west of the divide we have the Wisconsin, and the Big and Little Eau Pleine and Mill Creek discharging into it on the west side and the Little Eau Claire and the Big and Little Plover emptying their waters into the Wisconsin from the east; while in the Big Meadow district are several considerable streams rising in Portage county, running southwest into Adams and Wood counties and finally falling into the Wisconsin. In the southeastern division numerous small streams having their sources in the county discharge into White and Pine rivers, reaching the Great Lakes by way of the Fox, and many springs and small lakes are likewise found in this division. In most parts of the county the very best of water for all purposes is found in the earth at from twelve to thirty feet deep except that in the high prairie lands in Almond a much greater depth is required to find water, but in these localities water is easily raised by pump and windmill.

East of the divide the surface is gently rolling but easy of access and not materially interfering with agricultural operations. Between the divide on the west and the Wisconsin river the surface is generally level, sloping slightly to the west, while west of the Wisconsin and north of the city of Stevens Point the country is rolling and mainly timbered with hard woods, hemlock and pine. In the balance of the county oak prevails with occasional pine in some of its varieties.

The county is essentially agricultural, although water-powers are abundant. There is almost every variety of soil from the clay loam of the timber lands, the sandy loam of the prairie, and the muck of the low hay marsh to the sandy land of the openings, but all is fertile and productive with proper cultivation, without which, even under the most favorable conditions, farming is not profitable: but the fact is that Portage County, in variety and quality of soil, productiveness and value of products compares favorably with



any other county in its latitude. Three lines of railway traverse the county: The main line of the Wisconsin Central and its Portage branch south from the city of Stevens Point to Portage City there intersecting the Great St. Paul system, in thrice daily communication with Chicago and Milwaukee on the south, and with St. Paul and Ashland on the north by the Green Bay, Winona and St. Paul on with Green Bay on the east and the Mississippi on the west, and the Chippewa Valley division of the St. Paul system in the northwestern part of the county intersecting the Central, affording unexcelled facilities for market and travel. In addition, the almost inexhaustible waterpower within its limits is being rapidly improved and occupied with a humming industry which in the near future bids fair to furnish a home market for the large surplus products of the county now seeking consumption elsewhere.

The people are intelligent, industrious, and frugal in their habits, largely made up of foreign elements in which the German, Irish, Norwegian and Polish prevail, all of whom are rigidly pursuing their mission here to make the wilderness blossom and two blades of grass grow where none grew before they came. All in all the people are prosperous and through their industry and frugality the county is constantly growing in material wealth. No more desirable place can be found within the state to reside, to one who chooses the country and not the city for his residence, viewing it in the light of climate, productions, accessibility, character of the people, and above all freedom from any prevailing diseases.



# Stevens Point.



By Hon. Geo. W. Cate.

**T**HE city of Stevens Point, Wisconsin, is situated mainly on the east bank of the Wisconsin river at the head of the Shaurette rapids, a short rapids in the Wisconsin, and so called from a prominent Indian of the Chippewas, who in early times had his home on the west bank near this rapids. This rapids did not materially interfere with the running of lumber. The banks of the river were high and rocky up along the east bank, where the town was first started, but immediately below the mouth of the Slough emptying into the river where the flouring mills of W. W. Mitchell are now located, the water at ordinary stage was smooth and eddy-like; the bank low and gently sloping to the river, affording comfortable and convenient landing for canoe or skiff. From the foot of Shaurette rapids to the head of Conant rapids was but a short distance over land, but there intervened a couple or so miles of heavy rapid river with considerable fall in places, making the navigation by rafts difficult and dangerous before improvements were made by straightening channels and removal of rock. From the foot of these rapids to Crooked Rift about six miles was smooth river, then to the head of Grand Rapids a canoe might float in safety and be propelled up stream, but from the head of Grand Rapids some eleven miles, the river was an almost continuous rapid over which rafts could not run except at a stage of water considerably higher than ordinary. It is not known that any freight by canoe or small boat ever passed over the river from Point Bausse to the head of Shaurette rapids. At the time of the first occupation of the bank of the river within the present limits of the city there was no established road from Point Bausse or from that point to the country above Stevens Point, over which supplies might be carried: there was in fact no wagon road north of the city. Prior to 1839, the river north as far as the site of the city of Wausau had been explored and

its water powers ascertained, together with the feasibility of running lumber down the river in rafts, and the almost inexhaustible pine timber had become known. These conditions made the location at the head of Shaurette rapids on the east bank a place of importance and led to the building up of a village there. It was not because of any "portage around Shaurette rapids," for none ever existed. There could be nothing at the foot of Shaurette to carry, but because supplies were a necessity farther up the river, which might reach this point from below by wagon or sleigh, but no farther. From this point to Wausau was a good smooth river, at any stage, for canoe or skiff, except a half mile portage at Little Bull falls. Hence freights from below were unloaded at this point in summer, put in canoes made of pine trees, sometimes two lashed together, capable of carrying three or four tons, managed by two good men, and making the trip to Big Bull falls in three days. Delays necessarily intervened incident to the change, necessitating storage, to await boats to go above. Warehouses were built, the lumber business soon grew to large dimensions, more supplies were needed, hundreds of teams were soon on the road. This point was at the end of land carriage, and men and teams had to be cared for. Hence taverns and barns were built and the future city flung its flag to the breeze.

George Stevens, of giant frame and middle age, tired of society and eager for adventure and exploration, was the first to attempt to solve the problem of the profitable manufacture of pine lumber at Big Bull falls, and finding a market in St. Louis by the way of the Wisconsin river. Early in 1839, having perfected his plans by previous visits, he left Belvidere, Illinois, with men and teams loaded with supplies. His route lay through Winnebago portage, via Walsworth's and Point Bausse, at the foot of the Lower rapids; thence on the east side of the Wisconsin past all the rapids heretofore mentioned, not drawing rein until he reached the river at the head of Shaurette rapids, when he camped on the ground now occupied by W. W. Mitchell's lumber yard at the foot of Main street. He was the first white man that was known of to occupy, for business purposes, any portion of the site of the present city, and for more than fifteen years the supplies for the upper country were mainly transported in the same way. For ten years after the appearance of Stevens the greater part of the sup-

plies for man and beast were transported here from the state of Illinois, largely from as far south as Rock River.

Stevens Point was headquarters for the lumber interests and no place west of the Lakes and north of the Rock river was better known than it. Every farmer on his load of produce knew where he was going. It was the objective point of every boy going into the woods for a winter's work or for a trip out of the river on a raft in the spring, and of everybody seeking investment in lumber. Year after year, in fall and spring it was thronged with these classes, drawn from every state and territory northwest of the Ohio river then occupied by white men. Hence the name does "mean something" to the "early comers" and to all who know how it originated. Many would much regret to have it changed for any other.

The site of the city of Stevens Point remained government land until the survey and bringing into market of the six mile strip, so called, (three miles upon each side of the river.) September 10, 1844 Andrew Mullarky purchased and entered lot 1 in section 32, township 24 north, in range 8 east of the 4th principal meridian, and on November 26, 1844, he purchased and entered lot No. 2 of the same section. Both these pieces of land were conveyed to Matthias Mitchell January 6, 1845, and the same were platted into village lots by said Mitchell in 1847, being a small plat on Main street including the present Public Square.

For several years the builded portion of the then village was mainly confined to the small district covered by this plat. Mitchell built a tavern in the early spring of 1845, on the north side of Main street on the land now occupied by W. W. Mitchell for a lumber yard, right on the bank of the Slough and somewhat nearer the river than the lumber yard. The tavern bore the name "Raftsmān's Home." Mitchell kept it several years and was succeeded by Joseph B. Phelps.

Lot No. 3 of the same section was entered at the United States Land office November 26, 1844, by William H. Johnson. Upon this piece of land are situated the dam across the river, the site of the Clark mills and the Jackson Milling company's mill. Out of the entry of this piece of land grew a lawsuit of more than ordinary magnitude. Abraham Brawley had resided on Mill Creek for three or four years in the occupation of a sawmill known as the Brawley mill. He was a native of Meadville, Pa., coming of one of the best known families in Western Pennsylvania, for many years prominent members

in the democratic party of that state. Abraham was himself a man of much ability, and great and untiring energy; a politician of more than ordinary tact and adroitness, and was twice elected to the territorial legislature of Wisconsin, representing the counties of Portage, Brown, Fond du Lac, Manitowoc and Sheboygan. He was one of the prominent men in the state at the time of its admission into the Union, and when the United States Land office was removed from Mineral Point and established at Stevens Point in 1852 he was appointed register, Gen. A. G. Ellis being appointed receiver. Finally reverses in fortune overtook him and while-burdened with misfortunes he could not rid himself of he enlisted in the war and went to the front and perished, as thousands did, to find a resting place unknown.

Brawley conceived the design of building a sawmill on the Shaurette rapids and made no secret of his intentions to do so; and finally started to the land office to purchase the land. One William H. Johnson, commonly called "Dick," a laborer living at the head of Conant rapids, learning of Brawley's scheme thought to appropriate it to his own benefit and immediately started for the land office, about 150 miles distant, and succeeded in getting there ahead of Brawley and entering the land before Brawley arrived. But Brawley was not dismayed or disheartened. He had a good card left, as he was advised, and immediately filed notice of pre-emption, returned home and moved his family on to the land, first building a log house to put them in. His house was on the low land an hundred feet or so south of where the Weisner stables now are near the natural bank of the Wisconsin river, at present and since the building of the dam under water. His pre-emption was held invalid by the commissioner of the general land office. Brawley was then residing on the land, and he immediately brought an action in equity to compel Johnson to convey to him or that the court by its judgment and decree vest the title in Brawley on account of fraud in procuring the title. His attorney was Moses M. Strong. The case lingered in the courts many years, outliving Johnson, and was finally tried at Baraboo. Samuel Crawford, ex-judge of the supreme court appearing for Brawley, and there being no appearance for those claiming under Johnson, a proforma decree was made in Brawley's favor but never became a matter of record. In the meantime Strong had acquired title to the property under an amicable arrangement with Brawley and

this was the reason, probably, why no further proceedings were had in the courts. Also many people had settled on the land under deed from one or the other claimant, and the statute of limitations had run in their favor, and so the matter was allowed to rest. Strong's title was acquiesced in, and he subsequently sold all the valuable water power to Hon. Owen Clark. Brawley abandoned the land after the purchase by Strong and probably realized nothing from it, except perhaps payment of his attorney's fees.

The site of the city is favorable, generally level, the water obtained by means of wells is pure and easily reached. The water of the Wisconsin river, now furnished the city by means of waterworks, is also pure and suitable for household purposes. The growth of the city has been constant, not rapid. No boom has ever interposed to accelerate its growth, but every year has shown progress over the preceding, the vote at the spring election in 1896 being the largest ever cast. It may be truthfully said that the city has within itself and within easy grasp the elements of a larger growth in the not distant future of a character which must sooner or later contribute in a material degree to its future prosperity. The water power within the city now idle is large and valuable. Outside and tributary to it are the extensive paper works at Whiting, drawing their supplies of labor and other appliances from the city. The water power at McDill two and one half miles from the city is sure to be still further utilized as well as the large water power at Jordan and necessarily becoming feeders to the development of the business of the city.

The city within itself possesses in an eminent degree conditions making it a desirable place to live. It is healthy, and its landscape pleasant to the eye. It abounds in well-built churches, supplied by the ablest divines the denominations can produce, and a very large percentage of the population are church-going people. In the institutions of learning within its borders the city takes a just pride. The Sixth Normal school was located in the city in 1893 and speedily completed. This school ranks second to none in its educational facilities, and the attendance of the present year exceeds 400. The common schools of the city have ever been its pride and money has not been grudged by the people to place and maintain their schools upon a plane of the highest possible usefulness. The first district school taught within the present limits of the city was by Miss Mandana Hale, in 1846-7, after

wards the wife of N. F. Bliss, Esq., and now his widow. There are now seven ward schools giving employment to thirty-four teachers in commodious buildings furnished with all modern conveniences and appliances. In addition are three parochial schools with an average attendance of more than 800 scholars. A high school with an average daily attendance of at least 147 pupils and employing nine teachers and assistants. All the school houses are of the most substantial kind mainly of brick, the ward school houses costing not less than \$60,000.00, the high school building alone costing \$35,000.00. The city also donated \$22,000.00 to aid the state in the construction of the Normal school, making an aggregate of \$120,000 appropriated by the city for school buildings alone. In 1852 a church society of the Episcopal church was organized and a parochial school of the same order was opened and continued for several years. In the same year a small building was erected and utilized both for school and church purposes, almost entirely through the efforts of Gen. Albert G. Ellis, who may truthfully be said to be the founder of that church in the city of Stevens Point. He was its main stay up to the time of his death. In 1853 the Church of the Intercession was formerly dedicated and the first services held, a number of clergymen from abroad being present, amongst whom were Bishop Kemper, of Racine, Rev. Millet, of Beloit, and Rev. Thomas Green, who became rector. This was the first church organized in the city. Now the Methodist, Presbyterian, Baptist, Lutheran, Seventh day Advents and Irish, German and Polish Catholic have large societies and good church buildings and all in a prosperous condition.

The first newspaper to be established in the city was The Wisconsin Pinery, in 1852 by Gen. A. G. Ellis, shortly after passing into the hands of Caleb Swayze, by whom it was published until his death, three years ago. There is now published. The Journal, weekly and daily; The Gazette, The Post in German and The Rolnik in Polish. Situated upon lines of railway giving direct and speedy communication with the great center of trade, the city affords favorable location for those engaged in the manufacture of wood into articles which seek a market elsewhere, lying as it does just at the edge of the great timber belt, where is found all the more desirable woods. The great machine and construction shops of the Wisconsin Central railway are located at Stevens Point, affording constant employment to hundreds



## Postal Information.

### Classification of Domestic Mail Matter.

Domestic mail matter (that is, mail matter sent in the mails from some post office in the United States to another post office within the same) is divided into four classes, as follows:

#### FIRST CLASS.

Written matter, namely, letters, postal cards, and all matter wholly or partly in writing, whether sealed or unsealed. All matter sealed or otherwise closed against inspection is also of the first class.

The following named articles are among those subject to the first-class rate of postage—autograph albums containing writing; bank books with written entries; bank checks when filled out in writing, whether cancelled or not; written visiting cards, "old letters" whether sent singly or in bulk; stenographic or short-hand notes, diplomas, marriage, insurance, or other certificates filled out in writing; manuscript copy when not accompanied with printed proof-sheets; type-written matter, and manifold copies of the same, together with imitations or reproductions thereof, or of handwriting not easily recognised as such; drawings and plans containing written words, letters or figures indicating size, price, dimensions, etc; envelopes bearing written addresses; remailed postal cards wholly or partly in writing; printed assessment notices with amount due written or stamped in; printed price-lists or receipts with hand-stamped or written figures; printed blank forms, filled out in writing; printed cards bearing a written or marked date, when the date is not the date of the card, but gives information as to when the sender will call, or will deliver something mentioned in the printed part of the card; indented or perforated sheets of paper containing

characters which can be read by the blind, when they contain actual, personal correspondence.

**SECOND CLASS.**

Periodical publications, namely, all newspapers and other periodical publications which are issued at stated intervals, and as frequently as four times a year, which bear a date of issue and are numbered consecutively, are issued from a known office of publication, are formed of printed paper sheets, without board, cloth, leather or other substantial binding. To be entitled to recognition in this class, such publications must be originated and published for the dissemination of information of a public character, or devoted to literature, the sciences, art, or some special industry, and must have a legitimate list of subscribers, and must not be designed primarily for advertising purposes, or for free circulation or circulation at nominal rates.

“A known office of publication is a public office for the transaction of business of the newspaper or periodical, where orders may be received for subscriptions or advertising during the usual business hours, and this must be shown by the publication itself.”

**THIRD CLASS.**

Books, circulars, pamphlets, and other matter wholly in print (not included in second-class matter), proof sheets, corrected proof sheets, and manuscript copy accompanying the same.

“Printed matter” is defined by statute to be “the reproduction upon paper, by any process except handwriting, of any words, letter, character, figures or images, or of any combination thereof, not having the character of an actual and personal correspondence, provided it is easy of recognition as such.”

A “circular” is defined by the statute to be “a printed letter, which, according to internal evidence is being sent in identical terms to several persons,” and does not lose its character as such by writing therein the date, name of the addresses or of the sender, or the correction of mere typographical errors.

The following named articles, when printed upon paper, and containing no writing, are third-class matter: Almanacs, printed legal blanks and forms of insurance application; blue prints; printed books: canvassing and prospectus books

with printed sample chapters; blank check books and receipt books; printed cards, circulars, catalogues, and assessment notices wholly in print; Christmas and Easter cards; school copy books with printed lines and instructions for use; matter reproduced by the cyclostyle, hectograph, mimeograph, electric pen, or other similar process easy of recognition, engravings and wood cuts, printed labels, lithographs, printed maps (on paper); music books, and sheets of music; printed plans and architectural designs; postage stamps, cancelled or uncancelled; postal cards bearing printed advertisements (unaddressed) mailed singly or in bulk; price lists wholly in print; printed proof sheets, with or without manuscript; printed tags; printed calendars; United States treasury notes; printed valentines; press clippings, with name and address of paper, stamped or written in.

Seeds, bulbs, roots, scions and plants are, by the act of July 24, 1888, also mailable at the third-class rate of postage. Under this head are included samples of wheat or other grain in its natural condition; seedling potatoes, beans, peas, chestnuts and acorns. Not, however, samples of rolled oats, or other cereals which can only be used as articles of food; or cut flowers, dried plants, and botanical specimens.

#### FOURTH CLASS.

Merchandise, namely, all matter which is not embraced in the first, second or third class which is not in its form or nature liable to destroy, deface or otherwise damage the mail, or harm the person of any one engaged in the postal service, and not above the weight provided by law.

Under the head of fourth-class matter are included the following articles: Artificial flowers; photograph albums; blank autograph albums; blank books with printed headings; bill heads and letter heads; blank books; blotters printed or unprinted; blank cards; printed playing cards; Christmas or Easter cards printed on other material than paper, samples of cloth; cut flowers; dried plants; botanical and geological specimens; envelopes printed or unprinted; samples of flour, or other manufactured grain for food purposes; blank address tags or labels; dissected maps or pictures; metals; minerals; paper bags and wrapping paper, printed or unprinted; crayon pictures; oil or water-color paintings; pen or pencil plans or drawings; printed dress charts, and printed patterns, if they contain no written words, letters, or figures giving size, price

etc; blank postal cards in bulk packages; samples of merchandise, wooden rulers containing printed advertisements; wall paper; framed engravings, drawings or paintings; maps printed upon cloth; calendars or other matter printed upon celluloid; photographs retouched with India ink or water colors; and, in general all articles not included in the other three classes of mail matter.

Limit of weight of mail matter: No package weighing more than four pounds shall be received for conveyance by mail except single books weighing in excess of that amount, and except books and documents published or circulated by order of Congress, or official matter emanating from any of the departments of the Government or from the Smithsonian Institute.

Second-class matter is not subject to the four-pound limitation, and foreign mails regulated by postal conventions are also excepted. The limit of packages containing liquids, is four ounces, liquid measure.

### Rates of Postage.

#### FIRST CLASS.

On first-class the rates of postage are as follows:

1. On letters and other written matter, except that specially authorized to pass at third-class rates and on sealed matter or matter otherwise closed against inspection, two cents an ounce or fraction thereof.
2. On postal cards, one cent each, the price for which they are sold.
3. On "drop letters" two cents an ounce or fraction thereof when mailed at a letter-carrier post office, and one cent for each ounce or fraction thereof at offices where free delivery by carriers is not established.

#### SECOND CLASS.

The rate of postage on second-class matter when sent by the publishers thereof, and from the office of publication, including sample copies, or when sent from a news agency to actual subscribers thereto, or to other news agents, is one cent a pound or fraction thereof.

The rate of postage on newspaper or periodical publications of the second class, when sent by other than the pub-

lisher or news agent, is one cent for each four ounces or fractional part thereof.

The rates of postage on newspapers (excepting weeklies) and on periodicals not exceeding two ounces in weight, when deposited in a letter-carrier office by publishers or news-agents for delivery by its carriers, is uniform at one cent each; on periodicals weighing more than two ounces, two cents each.

Newspapers and periodicals when deposited by the publisher or news-agent in a letter-carrier office for general or box delivery, and subject to the rate of one cent a pound or fraction thereof, when deposited by other than the publisher or news-agent, for general or box delivery, the rate is one cent for four ounces or fractional part thereof.

Weekly newspapers when deposited by the publishers or news agents in a letter-carrier office, for delivery by carriers, or otherwise, are subject only to the rate of one cent a pound or fraction thereof.

#### THIRD CLASS.

The rate of postage on third-class matter is one cent for each two ounces or fractional part thereof sent to a single address.

#### FOURTH CLASS.

The rate of postage on fourth-class matter is one cent for each ounce, or fraction thereof sent to a single address.

#### Prepayment of Postage.

On First-class Matter—The postage is to be prepaid by stamps affixed; But first-class matter will be dispatched if one full rate two cents in stamps be affixed, and the residue of the postage will be collected from the address before delivery.

On Second-class Matter—When sent by the publishers or news-agents at the pound rate, the postage is prepaid in money, and newspaper and periodical stamps are affixed to the stub of each receipt given; ordinary stamps cannot be used for this purpose.

On Second-class Matter—Sent by other than the publishers or news-agents, the postage must be fully prepaid by postage stamps affixed.

On Third-class Matter—The postage must be fully prepaid by postage stamps affixed.

On Fourth-class Matter—The postage must be fully prepaid by postage stamps affixed.

#### Postage Due.

WHEN TO BE COLLECTED.—When mail matter of the first-class is prepaid one full rate—two cents—it shall be forwarded to its destination, charged with such amount of postage as may be due, to be collected on delivery.

No article of mail matter, except free matter, on which prepayment in full has not been made shall be delivered until the deficient postage has been paid.

If any mail matter on which by law the postage is required to be paid at the mailing office, shall, by inadvertence, reach its destination without any prepayment, double the prepaid rates shall be charged, but if part prepayment is made, only the actual deficiency in postage shall be collected.

Postmasters cannot lawfully accept postage stamps in payment of postage remaining due on mail matter. The amount due must immediately be paid in cash.

#### Unmailable Matter.

Unmailable matter includes all matter which is by law, regulation or treaty stipulations prohibited from being transmitted in the mails, or which, by reason of illegible, incorrect or insufficient address of person or officer, cannot be forwarded to its destination or delivered to the person for whom it is intended. Unmailable matter is divided into eleven classes, as follows:

##### HELD FOR POSTAGE.

Or matter insufficiently prepaid to entitle it to be forwarded. This includes domestic matter of the first class which is not prepaid at least one full rate, two cents, and all other domestic matter not fully prepaid.

##### MISDIRECTED.

That is matter without address or so incorrectly, insufficiently or illegibly addressed that it cannot be forwarded to its destination. This includes "nixes" the term applied to designate mail matter not addressed to a post office, or addressed to a post office without the name of the state being

given, or otherwise so incorrectly, illegibly or insufficiently addressed that it cannot be transmitted.

**DESTRUCTIVE.**

That which from its harmful nature is forbidden to be in the mails. Among these are: Poisons, explosives or inflammable articles, live or dead animals, insects or reptiles, (except queen bees and their attendant bees, and the "Australian Lady Bird") vinous, spirituous and malt liquors, and liquids liable to explosion.

**SPECIMENS OF CHOLERA GERMS.**

Disease germs, discharges of any kind, no matter how securely put up.

**COIN AND JEWELRY.**

That matter, to wit: Coin, jewelry or other precious articles, which by the provisions of conventions with foreign countries are prohibited from being sent in the mails to foreign countries.

**OBSCENE MATTER.**

This embraces: Every obscene, lewd, or lascivious book, pamphlet, picture, paper, writing, print or other publication of an indecent character; every article or thing designed or intended for the prevention of conception or procuring abortion; every article or thing adapted or intended for an indecent or immoral use; every written or printed card, circular, book, pamphlet, advertisement, or notice of any kind giving information, directly or indirectly, when, how or from whom, or by what means any of the herein-before mentioned matters, articles, or things may be obtained or made; every letter, upon the envelope of which, or postal card upon which indecent, lewd, obscene, or lascivious delineations, epithets, terms or language may be written or printed.

**LOTTERY MATTER.**

That is, letters and circulars known to be concerning lotteries, so called gift concerts, or other similar enterprises, offering prizes, or concerning schemes devised and intended to defraud the public for the purpose of obtaining money under false pretenses.

**MUTILATED.**

That matter becomes unmailable which is recovered from burned or wrecked mail cars or vessels, or which has been so damaged by any other means that it cannot be forwarded to

its destination. This includes all matter of value found loose in the mails, separated from the wrapper, label or envelope containing the address, so that the direction cannot be known, and all matter which is recovered from deprecations on the mails, which the Postmaster-General is required to restore to the owner when ownership is found.

**EXCESS OF WEIGHT AND SIZE.**

Those packages of domestic third and fourth-class matter which weigh more than four pounds, excepting books and official documents, and of foreign matter, which are in excess of the weight or size fixed by the treaty stipulations.

**SCURRILOUS MATTER.**

Matter upon the envelope or outside cover of which or postal card upon which, any delineations or epithets, of a libelous, defamatory, or threatening character, or calculated by the terms or manner or style of display, and obviously intended to reflect injuriously upon the character or conduct of another, may be written or printed.

Matter declared unmailable by an act of Congress approved March 2, 1889.

**Delivery of Mail.**

The delivery of mail is not controlled by statutory provision, but by the rules and regulations of the Post Office Department; the object of which is to insure and facilitate such delivery to the person for whom they are intended. In the general delivery of a post office, the postmaster should exercise a sound discretion in the delivery of letters to persons claiming to be the person named in the address, and who may not be known to him.

Postmasters are responsible for the proper delivery of mail. It is, therefore, for them to determine, after making inquiry and exercising due caution, to whom the letter shall be delivered.

Letters or circulars addressed to "Some Fur Dealer or Trapper," or to "The Leading Merchant," and similar addresses, are not deliverable.

The statutes of the United States do not protect mail matter after it has been delivered to the addressee, or according to his order.

may be delivered to the person in whose care it is addressed, as well as to the pensioner or a member of his family; but a letter addressed to a pensioner from the office of an agent for paying pensions must be delivered to the pensioner or some member of his family, even though addressed in care of a third person; because such address is prohibited. A pensioner's order, verbal or written, instructing a postmaster to deliver letters to him from a pension agent, or from the pension office, to an attorney, claim agent or broker must be disregarded.

Letters from the pension office in Washington, D. C. may be delivered to the pensioner himself, or to a member of his family, or to any other responsible person known to the postmaster in whose care they may be addressed. They must not be delivered to any (neighbor or acquaintance) person, except as stated below, who may call, even with the pensioner's consent, for the latter's mail.

Letters from the office of a United States pension agent, addressed to a pensioner must not be placed in the post office box of another person for delivery.

Letters addressed to a pensioner, from the office of any United States Pension agent, must be delivered only to the pensioner, or to a member of his family specially authorized by him to receive them. They must not be delivered to any person in whose care they may be addressed.

### The Registry System.

All valuable mail matter to be sent by mail should be registered. It will thus receive protection which is not always possible to give it if sent in the ordinary mails.

All classes of mailable matter, including drop or local letters may be registered; but not matter addressed to fictitious names, initials, or box numbers simply, or matter bearing vague and indefinite addresses.

The cost of registering mail matter is eight (8) cents for registry fee, in addition to postage; both of which must be fully prepaid by stamps affixed to the matter.

Postmasters are forbidden to address mail matter for the patrons of their office, to enclose it in the envelope, seal it, or affix the stamps.

Persons mailing letters to domestic destinations should add the name of the county to the address, and on letters to

foreign destinations, make the address as full as possible.

Letters and parcels found in the post office "drops" for ordinary mail with stamps affixed sufficient for registration, yet without the name and address of the sender, will not be registered.

If a letter has been marked by the sender "Registered," and then for proper cause is not registered at the post office the words "not in the registered mail" should be written or stamped across the face of the envelope so as to prevent detention while in transit.

Whenever it appears that any sender, after due notification, willfully and knowingly continues to use the post office drops for letters and parcels presumably intended for registration, and refuses to present such matter at the registry window, then said articles will be dispatched by the ordinary mail in which they have deliberately been placed by the sender.

#### **Suggestions to the Public on Postal Subjects.**

Mail matter should be addressed legibly and completely, giving the name of the post office, and, if to a city having a free delivery, the street and number, and the post office box of the person addressed should be added, if he has one. It is well to give the county, and spell the name of the state in full. To secure the return to the sender in case of misdirection or other errors, the sender's name should be written or printed in the upper left hand corner of all mail matter. The matter will then be returned to the sender if not called for at its destination, without going to the Dead Letter office, and, if a letter, it will be returned free.

When a number of letters or circulars are mailed together, addressed to the same destination, it is well to tie them in a bundle with the addresses facing the same side.

Money should be sent by money order or registered letter; otherwise it is liable to loss.

Patrons are advised to provide letter boxes at places of business or private residences, thereby saving much delay in the delivery of mail matter.

Postage stamps should be affixed on the upper right hand corner of the address side of all mail matter; care being taken that the stamps are securely affixed.

Postmasters are not required to receive in payment for postage stamps, etc., more than twenty-five cents in copper

or nickel coins, nor to affix stamps to letters, nor to make change, except as a matter of courtesy. They must not give credit for postage or money order.

Postmasters are prohibited from accepting anything but United States currency in payment for stamps, money orders, etc.

A subscriber to a newspaper or periodical who changes his residence and postoffice should at once notify the publisher, and have the publication sent to his new address.

Matter addressed for delivery at hotels, should be returned to the post office as soon as it is evident that it will not be claimed.

Letters temporarily sojourning in a city where the free delivery system is in operation should be marked "Transient" or "General Delivery," if not addressed to a street and number or some other designated place of delivery.

#### Money Order System.

Purchasers of money orders are cautioned:

To be careful, in applying for a money-order, to state correctly the name and address of the payee, as well as the purchaser's name and address; and upon receiving the money order, to see that the payee's name is correctly written in the body of the order. If the payee be an individual (not a firm, corporation, society or officer designated by official title,) his or her given name, or the initials thereof, must be stated.

The person who presents a money order for payment must be identified if unknown to the postmaster, unless identification has been expressly waived by the remitter of the order on his application therefor.

A money order may be repaid at the office of issue within one year from the date of issue, provided it bears not more than one indorsement. The fee will not be refunded.

A money order may be paid upon a written order, or power of attorney, from the payee, as well as upon his indorsement. The order or power of attorney must be filed with the paying postmaster.

In all cases of lost money orders the remitter, payee or indorsee may make application through either postmaster (the issuing or paying), for a duplicate or a warrant to be issued in lieu thereof.

More than one indorsement makes a money order invalid.




