PROFESSIONAL ISSUES: MEDICAL SETTING COMMUNICATION SCIENCES & DISORDERS 775/806

Summer Semester 2018

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Course Description:

The evaluation and management of persons with communicative disorders and/or hearing impairments within a medical setting will be addressed. This course includes information regarding medical settings, ethics, functional goals, reimbursement, documentation, and necessary interpersonal communication skills (to be successful).

Class discussion is a primary activity of this course. I provide the topics for discussion, either through guest speakers and/or readings. However, I let the discussions be **led by you**. I may jump into a discussion here and there, but the content and direction of each discussion is very much **determined by student participants**. My hope is that you will find discussions to be relevant and applicable. I view my role as one of a facilitator rather than "instructor" and act accordingly.

I have attempted to structure relevant and functional topics, information you may not have been privy to in the classroom. Most presenters are practitioners.

Course Objectives:

The graduate students in audiology and speech-language pathology will develop increased awareness of

- 1. Roles and responsibilities of professionals who work in medical facilities
- 2. Billing options and practices used within medical facilities
- 3. Documentation required within medical facilities
- Ethical issues of concern to speech/language pathologists and audiologists within medical facilities
- 5. The importance of communication when interacting with other medical professionals, patients and their families.

ASHA Standards:

This course contributes to the development of *Knowledge and Skills* as specified by ASHA, for acquiring clinical competence in speech-language pathology and audiology (see Revised Standards & Implementation for Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology). The knowledge and skills are acquired across a continuum, with increasing levels of independence, consistency, and problem-solving expected over time. Sixty percent of your grade will be determined by your participation in group discussions. You are required to participate in the assigned discussions each week that we have guest speakers and for an ethics discussion.

You must post at least two separate comments during each week. Posts can be in response to a peer's, or, if applicable, you can start a new thread. Please post your first comment by the <u>end of the day each Wednesday</u> and your second posting by the <u>end of the day each Friday</u>. You are encouraged to comment as many times as you would like over the required minimum.

Format with guest speakers

Once you have watched the guest speaker for the week and read any applicable articles, you are required to discuss the topic(s) that the speaker covered. Questions will be provided to help center your discussion, but please, feel free to include your own comments that you feel are relevant. In most presentations, you will have the opportunity to interact with the speaker.
