Why do the French, Francophone and by extension Europeans seem so cultured, savvy, passionate yet odd, strange, even weird to Americans? Why do they seem rude, "immoral" and have sometimes been called anti-American? How do they "think", behave and express their thoughts? What makes them different from Americans and how does one explain this "love-hate" relationship?

With a "macro" global approach, this course is designed to answer many of the still unexplained French-European behaviors and prepare students for France, Europe and the Mediterranean world before traveling as a student, scholar, on business or simply as a tourist. Issues of Immigration-Migrants from Africa and their children will be examined.

By defining and examining the *Habitus* of the French / Francophone then comparing it with the American one, through concepts of educational system, family, conversation, friendships, relationships and identity, we gain better understanding of differences and learn to improve communication in the real world (highly recommended for majors in French-German-Spanish-ESL, International Studies, History, Political Science, Education, Business, and Peace Corps volunteers).

What is and is not For Lang 251?

FLNG 251 is NOT your traditional French Films course, where various movements, directors and technics of film making are studied. We will use 12 modern French films made by European directors between the sixties and today, each of them presenting a real situation where cultural conflicts occur. Fictional and documentary films are used as documents to provide a "first-hand experience" about controversial issues that occur in language and culture, identity, immigration/Immigrants and Otherness.
