**Why** do the French seem so passionate, cultured, savvy yet odd, strange, even weird to Americans? **Why** do they seem rude, "immoral" and have lately been called *anti-American*? How do the French "think", behave and express their thoughts? What makes them different from Americans and how does one explain this "love-hate" relationship? What does it mean to "be French" today and what is *Frenchness*?

This course is designed to answer many of the still unexplained French behaviors and prepare students for France and the Francophone world before traveling as a scholar, on business or simply as a tourist. By defining and examining the <u>habitus</u> of the French, and comparing it with the American one through concepts of the family, educational system, friendship and conversation, relationships and business, we gain better understanding of differences and learn to improve communication in the real world (highly recommended for French teachers, majors in international studies, business, communication and Peace Corps volunteers).
