COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course has an online learning component as well online tests. I will be available in office hour as well as by appointment at posted hours. The homework will be done online in Canvas. Evaluations (in printed format or online) and other graded exercises will be done in an online/classroom setting.

COURSE CONTENT: Factoring and simplifying rational expressions, interval notation, solving absolute value equations, linear inequalities, rules of exponents and logs, solving exponential equations, functional notation, evaluation of functions and graphs.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: Upon the successful completion of this course the student will depart with the understanding that:

1. Algebraic expressions can be rewritten in an equivalent simplified form.
2. Solving equations/inequalities is a process where to find value(s) that yield a true statement.
3. There are several methods to use in solving equations/inequalities so analysis of the problem will determine the appropriate method to use.
