Career Planning Essentials

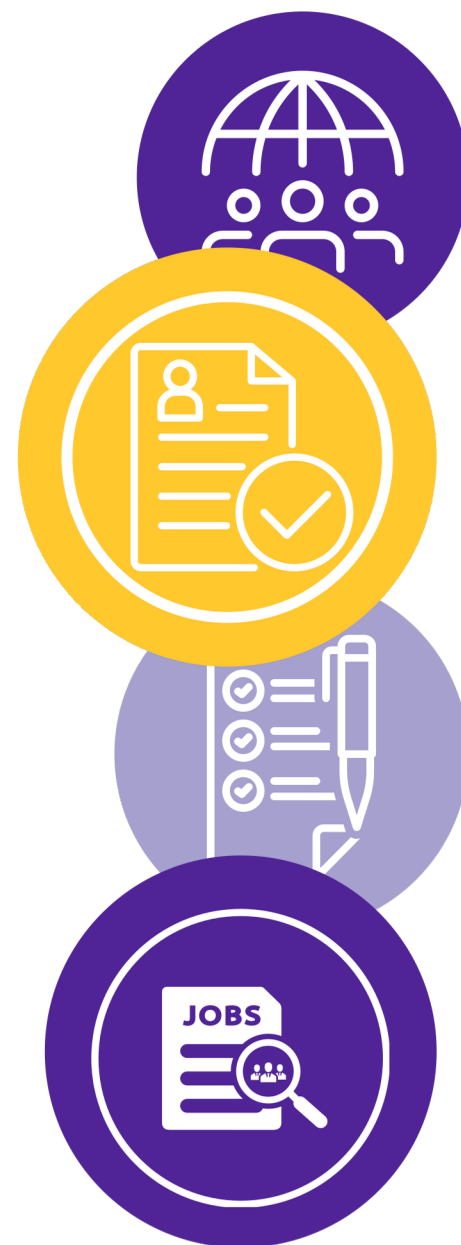
