# **Admission to UW-Stevens Point**

#### • Application Procedure

To apply to UW-Stevens Point as a transfer student, complete the UW System admission application form. You may apply online at <u>https://apply.wisconsin.edu/</u>.

• Request that your official transcripts be forwarded directly to the UWSP Admissions Office from both your high school and any colleges or universities you have attended.

While there is no deadline for applying to the University, early application is recommended because UW System enrollment management efforts may require us to limit our enrollment.

#### • General Admission Requirements to the University

Students from Nicolet College who will have earned 54 or more credits by the time they transfer to UWSP are generally eligible for admission with a grade point average of 2.00 or higher. If you will have earned fewer than 54 transfer credits by the time you transfer, you will need to meet the admission requirements in effect at the time your application file is complete. Please note that admission to the University does not guarantee admission to major or the Professional Education Program.

#### • When Should You Transfer?

Nicolet College students interested in a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Early Childhood Education at UWSP may remain at Nicolet College for three to four semesters, depending on course availability. Please work with the advisors at both Nicolet College and UW Stevens Point School of Education as some courses are not offered every semester.

# Admission to the Professional Education Program

Students with majors in Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, and Special Education must be admitted to this Program to register for upper-level Early Childhood, Education, and Teaching Methods courses.

Formal application to the Professional Education Program must be made. Deadlines: September 22 and February 22. Applications will be accepted up to the deadline. Late applications will be processed during the subsequent application period. Only students who meet all criteria listed below are eligible to apply. If the deadline falls on a weekend, the deadline to apply will be the Friday prior to the deadline. Transfer students who meet these requirements are encouraged to apply prior to transferring to UWSP.

Applications and questionnaires are available in the School of Education (SOE) Advising, Recruitment and Retention Office, Room 469 College of Professional Studies or at the UWSP School of Education website (<u>http://www.uwsp.edu/education/Pages/CurrentUndergrad/UndergraduateAdvise/appRequire.aspx</u>).

Unofficial copies of transcripts from ALL post-secondary institutions must be attached to the application, along with the completed questionnaire, which is attached to the application, and letter proving admission to UWSP, if not currently enrolled at UWSP.

## **Minimum Application Requirements for the Professional Education Program**

To apply for admission to the Professional Education Program, all requirements must be met, and passing scores submitted to the SOE Advising, Recruitment and Retention Office no later than the deadline. We recommend the following:

- Pre-Professional Interview take one semester prior to applying to the Program. Call the School of Education Advising, Recruitment and Retention Office, 715-346-2040, to set up your appointment, which may be done by phone. We are open Monday-Friday, 7:45-11:30 and 12:30-4:30.
- Take Communication 101 OR Education 205 OR the transfer equivalent at your campus (801-198 or 810-201 are the Nicolet College equivalent courses), during your freshman year. One of these must be completed PRIOR to applying to the Program.
- Earn an overall GPA of 2.75 or higher (this includes all courses that transfer to UWSP).
- Transfer students are encouraged to apply to the Program one semester PRIOR to attending UWSP, if all requirements are met by the appropriate deadline.
- Early Childhood, Elementary and Special Education majors are urged to apply as soon as they have completed 24 credits.
- Enrollment caps: NONE

# **UW-Stevens Point Teacher Certification Requirements**

- \* Denotes courses not directly equivalent to UWSP requirement, but acceptable in lieu of requirement for this major.
- "P" in front of a course number indicates that student must be accepted into the Professional Education Program in order to enroll in the course if taken at UWSP.
- Students will be licensed in regular education, ages 6-13, Middle Childhood through Early Adolescence Level (approximately grades 1-8). If they minor is a teaching minor, students may be licensed in that minor at the same age level, if all requirements are met. This major is only available as a Bachelor's of Science Degree.

Many of the following courses meet both UWSP General Education Program Requirements and Department of Public Instruction requirements.

# **Foundation Level of General Education Program:** This level must be completed no later than 60 credits (except Math 338 and Math Ed 228/229 and 338/339).

#### First Year Seminar (FYS): 3 credits required

# **Minor of at Least 22 Credits**

Students will be required to complete an approved 22 credit minor or an approved second major in a DPI approved area : Art History, \*Biology, \*Broadfield Social Science, Business Administration, \*Economics, \*Chemistry, \*Coaching, \*Cognitive Disabilities, Communication, Comparative Literature, Computer Information Systems, Dance, Drama, \*Earth Science, \*Emotional Disturbances, \*English, \*English as a Second Language, \*Environmental Education, \*French, \*Geography, \*Geology, \*German, \*Health Education, \*History, \*Learning Disabilities, \*Mathematics, Music, \*Natural Science, \*Physics, \*Political Science, \*Psychology, \*Sociology, and \*Spanish.

\*Minors are available for teacher certification.

NOTE: The Elementary Methods Block courses (17 credits) should be taken the semester prior to student teaching and cannot be broken up. Once a student is admitted to the Professional Education Program, they must commit to the semester for which they will take the Elementary Methods Block. Students will be expected to be out in the Stevens Point schools for 8-9 weeks full-time during this block.

# Competencies Competencies

- Demonstrate content knowledge by either 1) obtaining a 3.00 or higher in each teaching major and teaching minor or 2) submit passing scores on the required Praxis Subject Assessment exams. Students must meet one of the above requirements for teacher licensure. NOTE: Any student seeking a teaching license in French, German or Spanish are required to pass the ACTFL OPIC and WPT exams, regardless of their major/minor GPA.
- Submit an acceptable web-based portfolio on the Ten InTASC Teaching Standards. More
  information on these requirements can be found in the "Professional Education Advising Guide"
  section of the School of Education website,

- All Early Childhood Majors, Elementary Majors and Special Education Majors and Minors are required to pass the Foundation of Reading Test for Wisconsin at least one semester prior to student teaching.
- Passing scores on the Education Teacher Performance Assessment (edTPA) is required for all student teachers for licensure.
- You must receive a grade of C- or better in all "Early Childhood Education" AND all "Education" coursework.
- Early Childhood Education and Education courses taken more than 10 years prior to student teaching may not be applied to the program requirements. Students may appeal the currency of courses. The ADSOE will convene a review panel of appropriate faculty/advising staff to make a decision about that appeal.
- 120 credits are required to graduate.
- 40 credits of 300 and 400 level credits are required.
