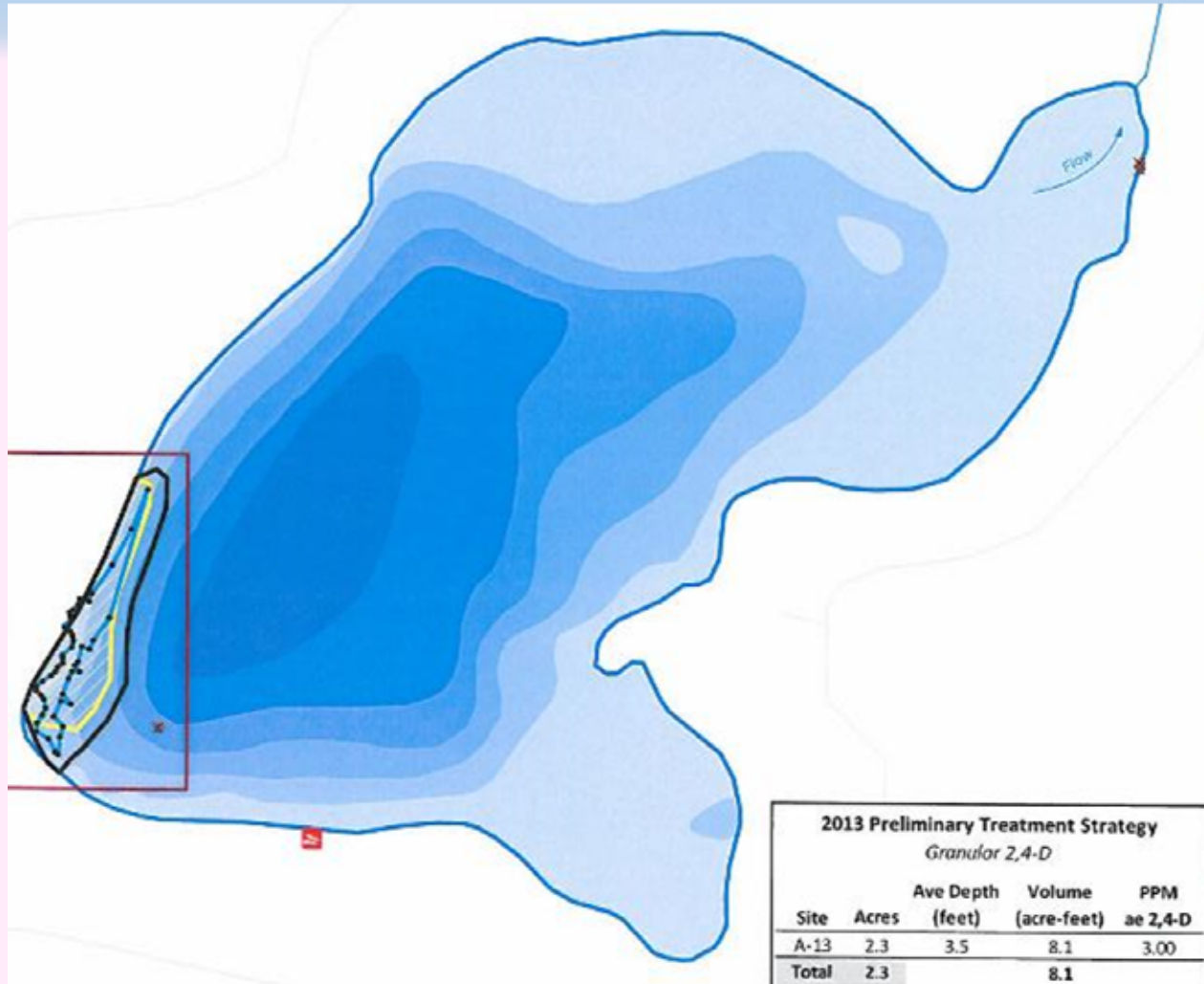

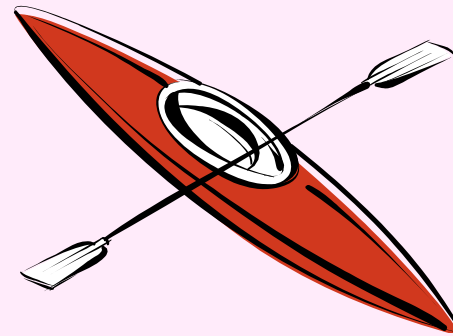


Spring 2013 Treatment Map



June 2013 – Present

Frequent monitoring of treatment area and hand-pulling areas to search for remaining EWM.



No EWM June 2013 – Sept 2016 (plants removed)







Early Detection is Crucial

- Early detection offers a chance of eradication
- Minimal ecological damage
- Low cost and effort to remove the population
