DATA SOURCES

Aesthetic shoreline condition field inventoried by Douglas Miskowiak, UW-Stevens Point and Ben Niemann, 2008. Areas observed from the littoral zone of Moose Lake were classified as follows: Natural Shoreline: Shoreline existing in a natural condition, without human modification of the riparian shoreline.

Modified Shoreline: Shoreline shows signs of human modification including slight to moderate removal of vegetation and/or visual presence of development.

Highly Modified Shoreline: Shoreline shows significant signs of human modification including intensive removal of riparian trees and vegetation and/or prominantly visible development. These categories were chosen as an indicator of natural scenic beauty.
