UWSP Marijuana Sanction Grid

Universal Prevention: Think About It; online education to be completed by all new students in Sept./Oct. or Jan./Feb. Failure to complete this course will result in a direct referral to an in-person class and the accompanying \$100 course fee.

Intervention: Predetermined Sanctions--These are "typical" minimum sanctions and may change based upon the circumstances of the specific incident and a student's prior conduct history. All sanctions are educational in nature and are designed to advance the development of the individual. The Office of the Dean of Students is charged with implementing the necessary processes for the success of these minimum sanctions. Failure to complete assigned sanctions by the given deadlines will result in a finding of 'Non-compliance with Disciplinary Sanctions", a hold being placed on the student's account, and possibly additional sanctions. Per UWSP Chapter 17 the University of Wisconsin – Stevens Point will hold students accountable for off campus behavior when it is of significant impact to the community or to individual safety.

- ** Typical sanctions for the illegal sale/distribution of drugs or possession with intent to distribute include suspension for a minimum of 12-months and/or expulsion from the institution in addition to other educational sanctions.
- 1. One, Two, and Four semesters are defined as **FULL** academic semesters not to include Winterm or Summer Session. The current semester is not included in which the suspension is enacted.
 - As each situation is unique, sanctions may be increased beyond the minimum, but would never be less than the minimum.
 Sanctions may or may not be duplicated.
 - Extensions for sanctions should be a maximum of one extension for 2 weeks. All other extensions must be cleared by the Office of the Dean of Students.
- When multiple violations exist, the student should be held accountable for all violations and applicable sanctions per this
 quide.

Medical Amnesty Policy - If a student seeks assistance from University officials (e.g. residence hall staff) or seeks medical attention due to a level of intoxication or drug use which reasonably appears to create serious risk to the individual, the University will respond and assist the student in need. Also, students who activity assist in obtaining assistance / medical attention for the individuals who are highly intoxicated, will not receive disciplinary sanctions, BUT may be required to complete an educational experience for violations of University and/or Residential Living policies. In lieu of disciplinary sanctions, the intoxicated student (and possibly an assisting student) will be required to meet with a staff person, who may issue educational requirements such as an alcohol or drug education course. This policy doesn not preclude disciplinary sanctions due to any other violations of University policy.
