By now Gene has arrived in P.A. I wonder whether he was too early or too late. He and I spent a swell week end together last Sat & Sun. I went down to Wash. D.C. via the train and arrived there about 8:30 P.M. We spent Sat eve talking and Sun morn. sight seeing. We saw the Wash Monument, Lincoln Memorial, Capitol & White House also quite a few other buildings. All together we really had a swell time. I enjoyed being with him.

By the time this gets to you I will have started on my ~~13th~~ 13<sup>th</sup> week here. Only 3 more to go and then — well if I am



lucky I will get 10 days leave. I certainly  
am looking forward to it. As soon as I finish
