
I am enclosing todays copy of the island paper. It has really improved since its first publication. I think I sent you a copy before didn't I?

A week from today shall be Mothers day. It shall be a day of many memories for me, as is each day. I hope it will be one of great satisfaction for your mother, a satisfaction in your children doing as you would wish them too. I feel each day is one of a renewed dedication to those things which you and Dad have taught us. I pray that with in this next year those of us who are away now shall be back home again. Wouldnt that be great, Mothers day Sunday 1946 having most of the Albertons together again. There would be some proud faces in church that morning, namely Bob's and mine. God has been good to us in the past, and I know that what ever the next year holds for us it shall be His will.

At Chapel this morning we had communion. It was a simple service, but in its simplicity one obtains something found no where else. We sang a few hymns and the Chaplin gave a few words that suited the occasion. We are holding our services here in the new day room they have built. See what a difference with the first service we attended here out in Thuyen. I talked with the Chaplin a little after the service. He has $\frac{7}{3}$ services each Sunday; and he said he feels lost now, he used to hold 9 each Sunday. It seems strange - the ~~st~~ ³ catholic (there I got it) Chaplins are only allowed by their church to give 3 services a Sunday. That is what the

Chaplin told me anyway. He has been here since Oct 5 and over now for 18 months. I admire his ~~to~~ view point towards denominations. There certainly isn't any discrimination in his feelings about them.

My best wishes had some beautiful sunsets this past week. The clouds have been heavy, and they have added to the evenings beauty. Each night I say "this is the most ~~cool~~ beautiful", only to find on the following night one entirely different and equally beautiful. I guess that's what I get for trying to limit God's powers.

Things are quite peaceful here this evening - most of the fellows are involved in something or another so every thing is quiet. It is just as well too for often we have a argument going that keeps every thing hot for a few days. All this makes time go fast tho and because of that they are appreciated.

I must close now and get to bed, Good night all and may God be with you through the week
