27 January 1946


Dearest Folks,

It is hard to believe that another month is almost past - it has already been a month since Christmas. The time continues to pass by rapidly and I am glad because of it.

Monday we had our X rays taken and as yet do not know the outcome of it. The check up was quick, and as soon as they read the plates our C.O. will be notified. Not many of the fellows here are worried - and the few that are are worried because of excess smoking and no other cause.

The new C.O. has taken a firm hold, and many things here have changed because of it. But most of them are to the good - so that isn't bad. One thing tho - he is a regular so there are two strikes against him already. Boy - the regulars certainly have a mania for swabbing the floors and washing wood work. You know that saying if you can't move a slight paint it - well with this guy its "if you can't move it, wash it then".

paint it. Ha - he caught me wednesday,
I was walking toward the galley from
the bron hut, about 10:00 in the morning to
get a drink. Upon being asked what I was
doing I said that I was going to get a drink
so he politely told me that after the drink
I could wash the spare parts cabinet in the
bron hut. I did, but he won't catch me again, for
after this whenever he sees me I always shall have
a pair of pliers or a screw driver in my hand
"On my way to fix the doodoo." There is
enough work in the bron hut to keep me more
than busy in the mornings and that should
come first. He's not as bad as I have made him
out to be tho - Ha. There is one thing that
he is doing that should have been done some
time ago - that is landscaping the grounds.
We are transplanting palms and placing two
small ones between each hut, and a large
one at the end of the huts. like this.

altho we won't be here to enjoy the trees there will be folks here, and the area has needed the improvement for some time. We are also transplanting banana trees along our drive way, about 10 feet apart. Well, to date we have 8 palms and 6 banana trees in, and more to go. About 500 yards behind our place, next to the little hill, there is a low area and a lot of moisture accumulates there. It is quite tropical and it is from that area that we have been getting the trees. Ha - alas getting the truck stuck!

The big event of the week was caused by my solley. On Thursday morning (very early - 3:30) she woke me by licking my hand. I got up to see what she wanted, and there in the corner of the hut were six very homely pups. She is very proud of them tho, and is also temperamental about handling them. I am the only one she lets near her, and she has me watch them when she goes out to exercise. Hunk and I built a house and filled it with rags for her. This just around the corner of the hut, and she likes it a lot.

I doubt if we have any trouble getting rid
of them when the time comes - we will
probably keep at least one male here.

Letters from both Dod and now come this
past week and they are small. also I received
a letter from Gene, and mail from Janice - so
it has been a good week for mail. Now your letters
bring you so close to me, it is almost as if I were
there in the living room talking with you
rather than you writing them there, and
my reading them here on carbon. Your
sermon on "How we Religion enough was very good
dad, and it ^{helped} ~~did~~ me a lot. How I wish we could
all be sitting together in church, and hearing one
of them - that will be wonderful".

There hasn't been any further word on our
relief, but it will come soon. I must close
now and get some sleep. May Gods love bind
our hearts together and make our purpose one.
