

Saigon, Vietnam
26 February 1967
Sunday Afternoon

My Dear Family -

It is nice afternoon and while things are fairly quiet (except for street noises) I want to talk with you. I am in my shorts, sitting at the desk in my room. About 0730 this morning the electricity went off and has been off all day. It isn't too much of an inconvenience except the room is quite hot and I am using a newspaper as a fan. Perhaps the electricity will come on again soon and then the air conditioner will start to work.

Harry and I decided to go to early church service - 0815 and while the attendance was low (about 15-20) the service was good and the sermon most helpful. I certainly appreciate the services here - look forward to them and get a lot out of them.

After church we walked down to the BoQ (Rex) and had a late breakfast and had a very fine visit with two students, Americans, who are here attending the University of Saigon and happened to be at the BoQ for breakfast. Both young men are realistic about their work here and the experiences they are having. They are dissatisfied in the quality of the instruction in that they feel it is below the level of the work they have had and hence do not take many classes, but rather are gathering material to use in thesis- and graduate work at home.

It was nearly 12 noon by the time we returned
to Chien Si.

The news this noon indicated that you have had
snow and cold weather - That's a change over the
mild winter - Ha!

We had scheduled a meeting of our team for 1400
to discuss the outline (proposed) of our preliminary
and final report. However part of the team had not
completed the current status section of their work so
I canceled the planning meeting until 0700 tomorrow.
I was disappointed for Howard was the one who held
things up - he participated in making the decision that
we complete those one by the 25th of February
but told me this morning that he was working on
other things and wouldn't be finished. It's too bad
to have one be "otherwise" but I hope we are
back on track tomorrow.

I have been addressing some post cards and I hope
I can mail this letter and some post cards when I go
down to supper tonight. Right now it looks like an early
supper and then a walk back.

Weekends away from you are the most difficult - I
miss you very much and look forward to being with you
all the time. With this I send my love to each one of you -
