

Air born over Vietnam

27 January 1967 <sup>1000</sup>

My dear family -

"and the dawn leaps up like thunder across the China Sea" - That is the way this day started. We got it started much before dawn - we walked to the military base (about 10 blocks) through the dark streets of Hue - in an early morning fog had a good breakfast and some excellent coffee and I was in good shape to face the day and its events.

The university provided a VW bus and a small land rover - and we went on a tour of Hue and surrounding areas. We went to the market first - most of the fellows wanted to purchase conical hats - I wondered and saw food, clothing, household items for sale. Then we drove to the Citadel - and the walled "Imperial City" that is ancient Hue - very beautiful in this tropical way -

vegetation is taking over, but we saw the  
kings and the aged women, and  
the other buildings for his mandarins and other  
officials. There we drove to see the "old"  
town - just on the side of a lovely hill  
above the airport area that was for  
former opium and well, with in walls. ~~signed~~  
we got back to the hotel in time to pack &  
check out - then to the military base for lunch  
and then drove out to the air strip.

Our plane was late in coming in to  
here and so far we have made two stops that  
we are scheduled to land at Saigon in  
about 30 minutes (1830). But - never real

this is a C-46 - I am sitting along  
one side and there are passengers lining the  
sides - civilians, U.S. military, Vietnamese military,  
Vietnamese civilians - and down the middle of the  
plane is supplies - an air craft repair stopped  
down - boxes of supplies and other items -  
being returned to Saigon for the plane  
we have stopped in refueled plane - and

I am determined to get back to the University (3) and get a hot shower. I have been 3 days, since the hotel in Hanoi had only cold water and that only lasted a few minutes each morning before it was gone.

The team is tired and anxious to get back to Saigon - food and rest in more familiar surroundings. I guess the experience at the University of Hanoi left us all a little worn out and this for a couple of the team wouldn't go about as much surprise as they would take. It is interesting to see what how they act and react to conditions and needs that are so different from any job of their experience. I guess there is not a way that you can predict or anticipate their work until one actually has the experience. By and large though they are doing well and these references should help us understand each other.

Before leaving we arranged for the members of the team to return - probably on February 16-17 & 18<sup>th</sup>. I think that Howard set

will go while Harry, Mel and Don go to see  
Cartha at the same time. The next week (January  
30<sup>th</sup>) we have our scheduled meetings with  
the faculties of the University of Saigo - as to  
as the time up to Tet is already "booked"  
and we are already scheduling days for the  
period following Tet.

I'll write more about Tet later but you can  
probably know from reading that it is the  
Lunar (Lunar) New Year and is the big holiday  
here. Everything closes down and it is wrong  
to try and conduct business with Vietnamese  
during that time. A little like making appointments  
on Christmas and New Year.

The last two letters to you I mailed from  
Hue - I'd be interested in how long it takes  
them to get home in comparison with  
the letters I mail from Saigo.

I'll try to add to this after supper  
today - when at most 10 p.m.

⑤ Now I have just finished taking a shower - washing my hair and also washing out the underwear and socks I used on the trip to Hue. A shower is a fine thing and I have that feeling that one gets after a day at the beach - then coming in and taking a shower - tired but relaxed and ready to go to bed.

Our plane landed at 1900 - our dinner was at the airport and we were soon back at the hotel. I had dinner with Bob La Follette, Jim Singleton and a Dr. Tolle - the USAID advisor (education) to Ambassador Koren.

When I returned I found a letter from your mother, it is good to hear from her.

Let me say good night to each of you now - and with it all my love.
