My Dear Family -

The "Grand Ole Opry" is on the Armed Forces Radio Station. I remember, as I listen, hearing the program by the same name on the radio when I was a boy - it, and Saturday Night Barn Dance. While the type of music is the same somehow it doesn't seem like Saturday Night. I guess I have commented about it before - but with the weather being what it is - the days seem to be the same - and one seems to blend into the next.

We have had a full day but it has been a good one and we seem to be moving again - we met for two hours this morning - as a group that is, and for another 4 hours this afternoon. We hammered out the ~~rough~~ drafts of the components of our major sections of the preliminary report. That's all but the last section and we will meet tomorrow morning at 1000 on that.

Our outline will have 4 major sections: 1) Introduction: a definition of the task; 2) Problems and Solutions; 3) Next Steps: Sequence and Control; 4) Appendix. We are well along on parts 1, 2 & 4 - with the basic ideas ~~by~~ hammered out and now the task of editing and writing (writing and editing that is - in that order). And the job of doing part 3.

We have a lot of work ahead of us but it looks like we may make it.

I walked down town & back this noon - had a grilled cheese sandwich at the Tex. - and it was good exercise to

get out.

I still need you, Jon, and Leidy to trace the outline of your foot on a piece of paper so I can look for some shoes. Please do it right away so I can find something.

Dr. Tho, the Minister of Education, said his wife would help with Ao-Dai's so I'll get at that this next week. Dr Tho said they had a good tailor and would be happy to help out. That will be good.

These days are tiring - it is hard work to hammer out some of these concepts and I find myself worn out at the end of the day.

Today mail brought the section of the February 12 & 13th NY Times - and also a letter from Mother. She wrote about Grandmother Heeledorff's fall and hospitalization - and also that she was writing to you.

I notice that my writing is getting smaller - guess I better quit and get some sleep.

I have just finished a good shower - now I feel refreshed and relaxed and I want to talk with you for a while before going to bed.

Before taking my shower I got a note off to Phil for his birthday - I wanted to send something to him but have looked the past couple weeks and didn't find anything that seemed suitable. \$5 is enclosed with this note and that can supplement what you send him.

I certainly enjoyed well today with the mail - all from Stevens Point - and letters from you (copies of the 28th), Gordon, Bill and Kurt. Also a short note from Mrs. Baum along with a note from Mr. Herman (Philosophy Dept), Roland Taylor, and Paul Bulger (student at Buffalo New York. Isn't that great! It really made me feel good - to read the mail and especially to read and re-read your letter.

I certainly hope things work out for Steve - perhaps my letter wasn't right but I tried to share my mind and heart with him - without pressuring. I'll look forward to hearing from you in the next few days - to see how things come along.

Wonderful news about Cindy - I can imagine how pleased she must be now - she has been patient and

it has been a long time. Tell her she should celebrate by writing a letter to me! Did the braces stain her teeth at all? -

→ This has been a hard day but we too are making progress. Vielle is doing a great job on the report - doing the writing now as a result of our meetings, etc. We are about half through with the preliminary report and should make an Friday deadline.

We did hit a snag - a major one - on the first part of the agenda - the status of current conditions. I had asked the fellows to give the copy to Art Rickett to be edited - well Art said it was all done and given to the secretary to type on mimeograph strike. Three of the fellows started proofing today and the copy is terrible. Errors in sentence structure - capitalization, etc. I still don't know what I'll do - guess we may have to not include it in the preliminary draft and then go to work on correcting it and then re-type - sketch in the final draft. Anyways I'll wait until tomorrow to make that decision.

I haven't gotten answers off to some of the letters I have received the past week but will wait and do that after the preliminary report is finished.

I am glad you enjoy my letters - it is wonderful to spend part of each day with you this way and I certainly look forward to hearing from you and anticipate a letter once in a while from the grandchildren.
