## Management Principles Business 320 Lecture 1 Tuesday, Thursday 5:00 PM to 6:15 PM.

#### Course Description: (from UWSP Catalog)

Management Principles is a 3 credit course focused on management theory. It explores different ways that managers function in both profit and non-profit business and industry organizations. It examines management behaviors from both functional and organizational perspectives.

This course introduces the student to progressive management concepts and practices. The course's fundamental building blocks are the managerial functions of planning, organizing, leading and controlling. Topics include organizational culture, business ethics, globalization, business strategy, organizational structures, leadership and teamwork.<sup>1</sup>

#### **Course Objectives**

What learning objectives should you have for this class?

- 1. Understand how managers work within organizations to achieve objectives
- 2. Develop an understanding how events in business are helping to shape our world.
- 3. Gain a better understanding how organizations are structured and staffed.
- 4. Development understanding of analytical, planning and decision making skills.
- 5. Present your ideas in a clear, coherent and persuasive manner in front of group.

#### **Reading assignments**

The reading assignments are on the detailed schedule in this syllabus. <u>You should read the assigned</u> <u>chapters prior to coming to class</u>. We may deviate from the detailed schedule depending on how quickly we cover the material in class or how long the news articles take. My intention is to focus only on the most important concepts in the textbook. However, you will still be accountable for developing an understanding of the other concepts and terms covered in the text book chapters that we cover. If you have questions about something we did not cover in class please ask.

**Grading :** Final grade determined based on total number of points. (*not percentages*) The way to determine your grade is compute your total points and find where your total fits within the letter grading scale on page 4 of the syllabus.

Exams: (3 exams 150 points each) Count your best 2: Total 300 points-

There will be 3 exams you get to select your best 2. **Exams are online** The exam needs to be taken during the time period it is open. Failure to take the exam on time will result in the exam either receiving a zero or being the exam that does not count. If you are unable to take the test during the appointed time you must let me know 24 hours prior to the test opening. The test time period will be announced in class and in the news section for this class. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they have a secure and reliable internet connection. An unreliable internet connection is not an excuse for missing an exam. Any internet issues will be forwarded to IT for investigation. All students will take an exam that follows the same format.

#### Final Exam 150 points

Selected important concepts and terms from the book 150 points same format as mid- term exams. Finals must be taken during finals week. #### Participation and attendance in class 50 points

During class we will discuss management topics. You are expected ask questions of people presenting news items and to come to class prepared to discuss the material scheduled for the day. Regular attendance will be a portion of this grade. Points awarded for participation in class will be determined solely by the instructor.

**News Articles Guidelines for News Article (**News Articles **50 points** (each person does 1) see detailed instructions in D2L

Each person is required to present 1 news article during the semester. You will present in front of the class and use **Power Point**. Any additional visual aids are also welcomed. There will be a **signup sheet** for the date to do the presentation. Due to the number of people in class and the large number of presentations, it is the student's responsibility to ensure that they are ready to present on the day they have signed up to do the news article presentation.

It is also the student's responsibility to keep track of the date that they have signed up to do their presentation. If for some reason a student misses their presentation date-they will be able to make it up only if there is sufficient time at the end of the semester. Lecture material that has not been presented takes priority over news articles. If there is not enough time the student will receive a zero on the news article assignment. The determination on whether there is sufficient time is solely at the discretion of the instructor. We will do 6 per allotted day for news reports. Total time per individual report will be 5 minutes. (including questions)

### Once you have signed up you are committed to that day and cannot change it.

<u>I do not accept emailed news articles or presentations. In order for a news article or presentation to</u> <u>count as having been completed it must be submitted to the drop box within 24 hours of your</u> <u>presentation.</u>
