Course Description: Organizational Theory. Use an open system perspective to examine how managers deal with factors that affect the organization. Consider factors such as environment, technology, and goals in determining the nature and structure of the organization.

Required Textbook: Organizational Theory and Design, 12th ed., Daft.

Course Prerequisites: Students in this course must be majors in Business Administration, Accounting, Business Economics or minors in Business Administration and must have completed Bus 320 or Bus 325.

Cases: There will be a variety of <u>individual</u> case-based projects (One per module/chapter) requiring you to submit documents in Canvas.

If grades are adjusted from the traditional scale, you should expect ~25% of the class to get an A of some sort, and ~75% to get either an A or a B of some sort. This will be constrained by the following simple rule: I generally don't curve by more than a full letter grade. (Corollary: If you earn less than 50% of the available points, you should not expect to receive a passing grade.)

You can expect to receive a zero for a grade on any work not completed by the due date.
