Activities

You are required to complete a minimum of 5 of these to successfully complete the course (and complete the reflection paper). You can attend all that have space (i.e. the lot of them, if you want).

- Chainsaw removal of invasives and woody species
 - If you have S212 or Pulpcut supervisor, this is assisting on (Feb 16th...cutting in Riparian Corridor). Limit 8 students
 - If not, I will be running a basic saw training (indoor session 100-200 Feb 1) and a Saturday and Sunday field session (Likely Feb 2 and 3). Limit is 8 students
