COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course requires students to identify and secure fieldwork placement for completion the following semester. The fieldwork experience develops skills in program planning, implementation, promotion and evaluation, oral and written communication, collaboration and networking.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

At the conclusion of HWM 493, students will:

- Identify and evaluate prospective fieldwork sites.
- Identify and secure a 150-hour fieldwork opportunity, to be executed in the subsequent semester.
- Complete the Fieldwork Experience Plan with goals to be met during the fieldwork experience and is signed by the site supervisor and the student.

Students secure instructor approval of their Fieldwork Experience through a signed Fieldwork Experience Plan by the designated due date to pass this course. Examples of fieldwork placement include local YMCA, health care facility, school district, public health department, senior center, non-profit, corporate wellness facility.
