Dramaturg's Notes

Classical Greece is an influential time period in history. The Greeks gave the world many things such as, architecture, philosophy, logic, literature and natural philosophy. Philosophers such as Socrates, Plato and Aristotle formulated ideas about how the world worked; the study of history was created by Herodotus and Thucydides; artists tried to find more realistic ways of representing the world; and doctors like Hippocrates started to look for rational reasons for the causes of illness and disease. We can look to this period to understand many aspects of history and culture today.

Origins of theatre are traced back to ancient Greece. Greek Tragedy is the oldest form of drama in the Western World. It served many purposes; it was a form of entertainment as well as a form of worship to the gods and goddesses. Ancient Greece was a polytheistic and a fatalistic society. Fate was inescapable and controlled by the soapopera-like characters of the gods. This determined motives and decisions made by characters within Greek drama. The stories were well known to audience members as well as the specific conventions of a performance. Audiences knew ahead of time the stories performed in drama, but they still attended performances in hopes to see the great heroes of tragedy.

One of the great tragedies we still have today is Antigone. The play Antigone was written c. 441 BCE by the Greek tragedian Sophocles. Sophocles is considered the most successful Athenian playwright of the 5th century BCE and in his lifetime, he wrote over 120 plays (7 still remain today). Antigone takes us to the war torn city-state of Thebes. The city of Thebes was steeped in epic tales and filled with a mythhistory that was well known in Greek society. One of the known myths of Thebes is the story of Oedipus. Sophocles depicts the myth in his play, Oedipus Rex. At birth, Oedipus was prophesied to murder his father and marry his mother – so his parents, Laius and Jocasta, leave him chained to a mountain. After being rescued and raised by another family, Oedipus learns of the prophecy and attempts to avoid his fate by running away. He unknowingly fulfills the prophecy by killing King Laius while traveling on the road, and marrying Queen Jocasta after saving Thebes from the Sphinx. When he discovers that the prophecy came true, he gouges his eyes out and exiles himself from Thebes. Oedipus had four children by Jocasta: two brothers, Polyneices and Eteocles, and two daughters, Ismene and Antigone. After Oedipus'

death, his two sons were instructed to switch off ruling Thebes every year, but both sons wanted full power. So an angry Polyneices left Thebes and became ruler of Argos. Polyneices leads the Argive army to Thebes for a great battle. The war ends with both brothers killing each other, and the story of Antigone begins in the aftermath of the battle.

The burial of the dead brothers is a conflict within the story of Antigone because proper funeral rites served a significant purpose in society. The completion of traditional funeral rites by those deemed responsible indicated that the family was in good health and that the family bond between members was strong. The performance of the funeral rites fell foremost on the male relatives of the deceased. If traditional rites were not done correctly, or if performed by an inappropriate individual, it signified an unhealthy family whose members had abandoned their responsibilities.

One thing that audience members living in the 21st century should keep in mind is that *Antigone* is a purposefully tragic play. The purpose of tragedy for the Greeks was to allow the audience to reach catharsis, the purging of emotions. Aristotle writes on catharsis in his Poetics. He wrote that it was important for society to purge emotions because there would be less fear and pity amongst people, allowing society to function better. This holds true today as it did for audiences 2,000 years ago.
