#### Director's Note

When I first met with the production team for *Be Aggressive*, I tried to pin down what I think this play is really about. I made it clear that it is not about cheerleading—I wanted to make sure we never called it a play about cheerleading. I think this play is about unexpected change. The characters avoid facing the irrevocable changes in their lives rather than meeting the challenges that change presents. They are unable, unwilling, or unready to move forward. With that in mind, I presented my ideas to the team.

Sand. It was one of my first impulses as I began working with the play—I knew I wanted there to be a sense of sand. Sand is the result of change, of time eroding the ground upon which we stand. It can shift suddenly and change without warning. Sand is also an indicator of time; in an hourglass, it drops with every second. Each grain shows the irreversible passage of time.

Triangles. I kept thinking about triangles for some reason. Cheerleaders often form pyramids and triangles—a megaphone is a triangle and cheer skirts have triangular sections. An hourglass is a pair of triangles joined together at the center. There are also many triangular relationships in the play—Laura, her father, and her sister in particular.

Cheer. While the play is not about cheerleading, cheer is an important part of the play. Everyone in the play would like to have someone or something to cheer for (or against). They also crave someone to be cheered by. The idea of "cheer" also challenged me—does it last? When someone tells you to cheer up, it is a command, to which we so frequently comply. Is it from complacency or true happiness?

Throughout the play, the characters repeat the cheerleading standard question of "Ready?" There is only one response—"OK." I think the question of being ready is central to the play as well. Is there a way to be ready to face what the world throws our way? A grain of sand in an oyster causes irritation that yields a precious pearl. Do the changes we face, although often sudden and sometimes devastating, make us able to create something beautiful and smooth as we cope with them? I think so and I think that by the end of the play, the characters might be ready to try. Okay.
