#### A Note from the Director:

Alternately funny and poignant, Lanford Wilson's beautiful use of language reveals a generation in quiet crisis. He shows us the "morning after" - an emotional, physical, and spiritual hangover from the era of the Flower Child and the Vietnam Conflict.

The title refers to the day AFTER the major national holiday that celebrates not just the founding of America, but its founding spirit. The "high" is gone and we're back to reality. It is life in the light of the ordinary and not in the alluring flash of patriotic pyrotechnics. A time to face up to responsibility, commitment, involvement, continuity, and survival.

Tonight, we laugh with and grieve with a lost generation of young adults trying to piece together the confetti of their lives after the parade has passed.

All of them, in their own way, have been broken and reconstructed. In the wake of a lost war abroad and a failed social revolution at home, they are faced with the reality that life is a cause that demands its own fierce commitment. Each must finally take responsibility for their individual choices and actions, draw new strength from lost dreams and regrets, and finally bury all of life's "might have beens" - recommit to the future.

Today's parallels are unmistakeable. We, as a society, find ourselves on the brink of... something. Perhaps something great; something significant: hotly debated overseas conflicts; global climate/energy crises; potential future leaders who bring the promise of radical changes and, with that promise, hope? It's all rushing toward something, to be sure. But a lesson has been learned, we do not dive with wild abandon into waves of hope. A child's faith no more. We're colored by what was; we are 'cautiously optimistic'.

Will our caution save us from being hurt again? Or will our caution be the very downfall of that hope? A decade from now, we may find ourselves in the shoes of these characters. We may recognize facets of ourselves onstage tonight – some facets of which we may not be particularly proud, but none of which are beyond redemption. If it all comes to nothing, how will we choose to cope with that loss?

Ultimately, what emerges from Fifth of July is the portrait of a loving, flawed family whose core, in spite of everything, is surviving.
