Notes from the Director:

The moment I began reading Laura Eason's play 40 Days, I formed an instant connection to the story. These were people I knew, in a setting I understood, while at the same time I was struck by the brave and powerful theatricality of the piece. I was drawn into the play by an unwavering force contained in its language and use of metaphor. The play demanded I use my imagination to fill in the gaps it consciously created. There was no way to read this play without working and engaging my own personal creativity to make full sense of it – it was not a passive experience. It had been a long time since I had read a play that dealt so directly in the world of metaphor, and yet also gave me a reality within which to understand the story. It scared me a little to think about directing this play, but it also greatly excited me. There were physical sequences (without any dialogue for the actors) to convey a thought and idea that were barely outlined by the playwright, and yet at the same time these sequences seemed ripe with opportunity. There were dramatic flourishes that demanded intelligent and creative solutions from the designers and technicians of the show, and yet nothing was spelled out concretely and asked for further interpretation by its collaborators. In short, this was a piece that had to be attacked by an ensemble not only of actors, but designers, technicians and ultimately an audience willing to engage their imagination and learn how to participate in the play as it unfolds.

This type of play is daunting and yet freeing at the same time. There are many questions asked, and finding the path to the answers is a difficult process. It is my hope that this journey will not only be a great challenge, but also great fun. I hope you leave the theatre tonight and have various opinions about what you have seen, and how you personally interpret it. 40 Days is not wholly realistic, nor wholly theatrical – it bridges the divide and ultimately asks you to decide how you choose to view its story.

I would like to thank Laura Eason for sharing her play with all of us here at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point. You are seeing the first fully staged production of this play. It has been an honor and privilege for this entire ensemble to work on it, breathe life into its story and present it for your entertainment.

Lastly, and most importantly, thank you for supporting live theatre.
